SAZERAC

"The Sazerac is the original cocktail, and it's very New Orleans, so of course it's popular during Mardi Gras," says Dugas. "In the early 1800s, it was made with cognac, but decades later cognac became harder to find, so rye whiskey was substituted. And when absinthe was banned in the United States in 1912, bartenders started using Pernod or Herbsaint to coat the glass."

- 2 oz. Sazerac rye
- 3 dashes Peychaud's bitters
- 1 drop Angostura bitters
- 1/4 oz. simple syrup
- 1/4 oz. Herbsaint

Fill a rocks glass with ice, pour the Herbsaint into glass and swirl it around to coat. In a separate mixing glass, stir together the Sazerac, bitters, and simple syrup. Dump out the ice and the Herbsaint and strain the ingredients from the mixing glass into the rocks glass. Garnish with a lemon twist. Go find some trouble.

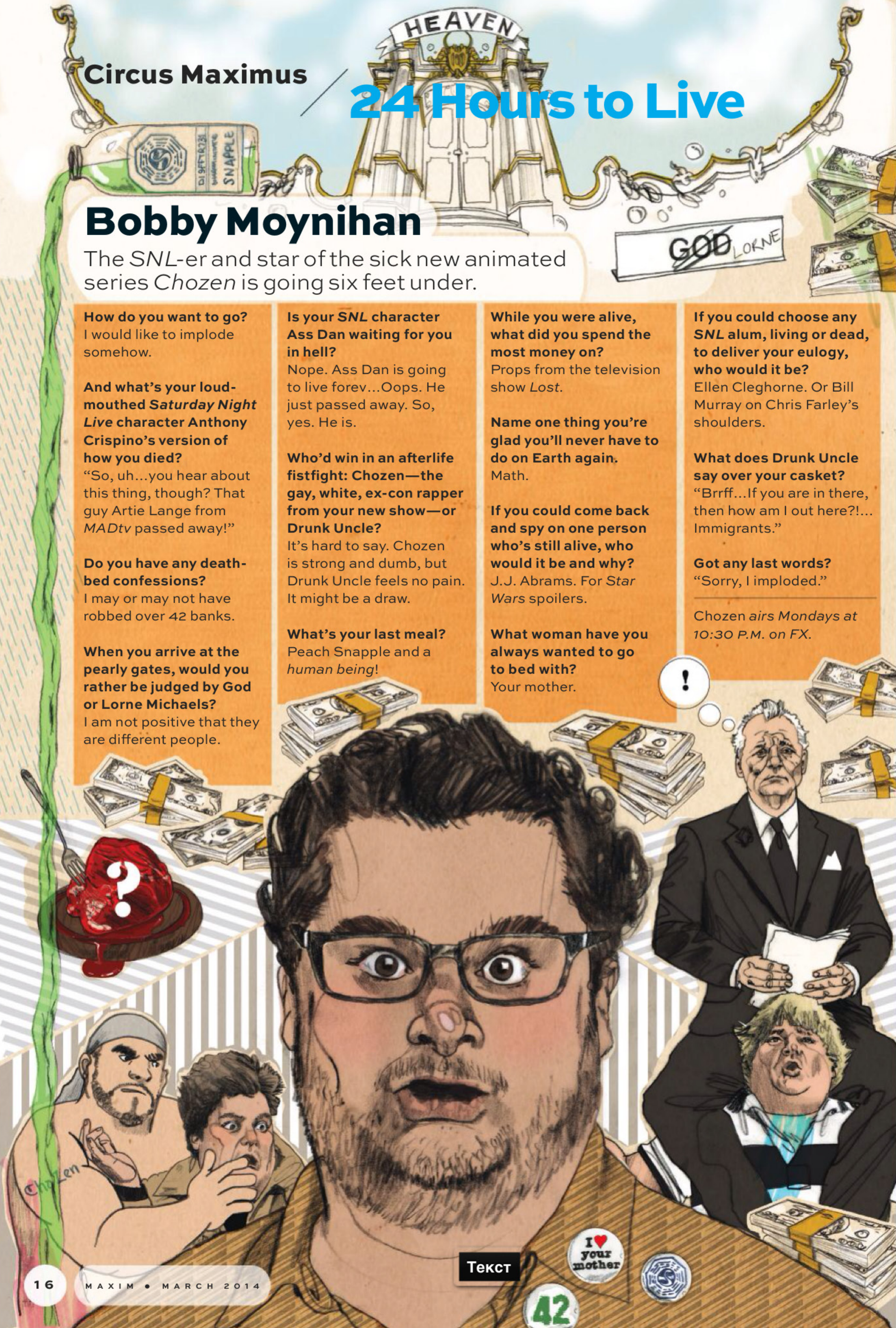

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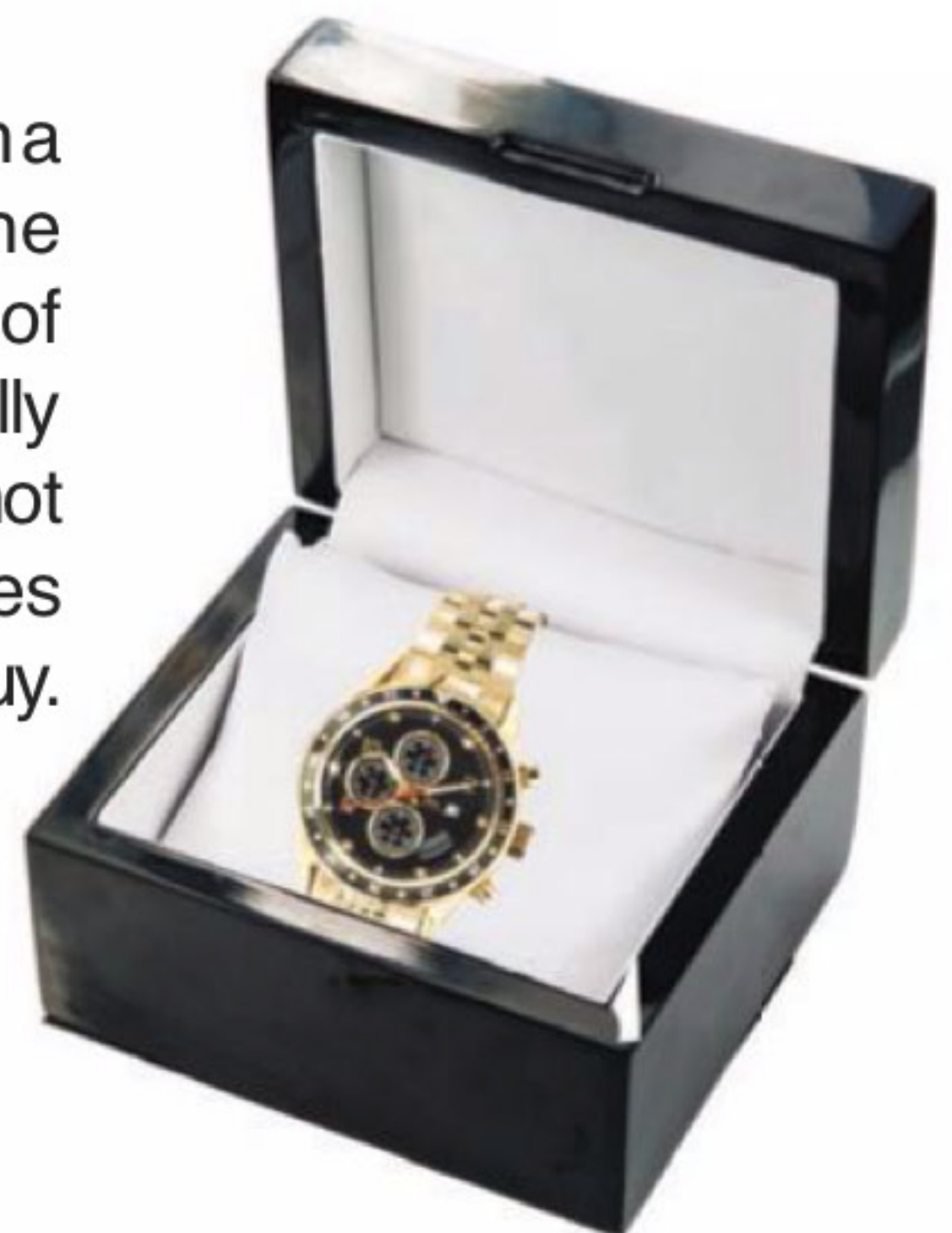
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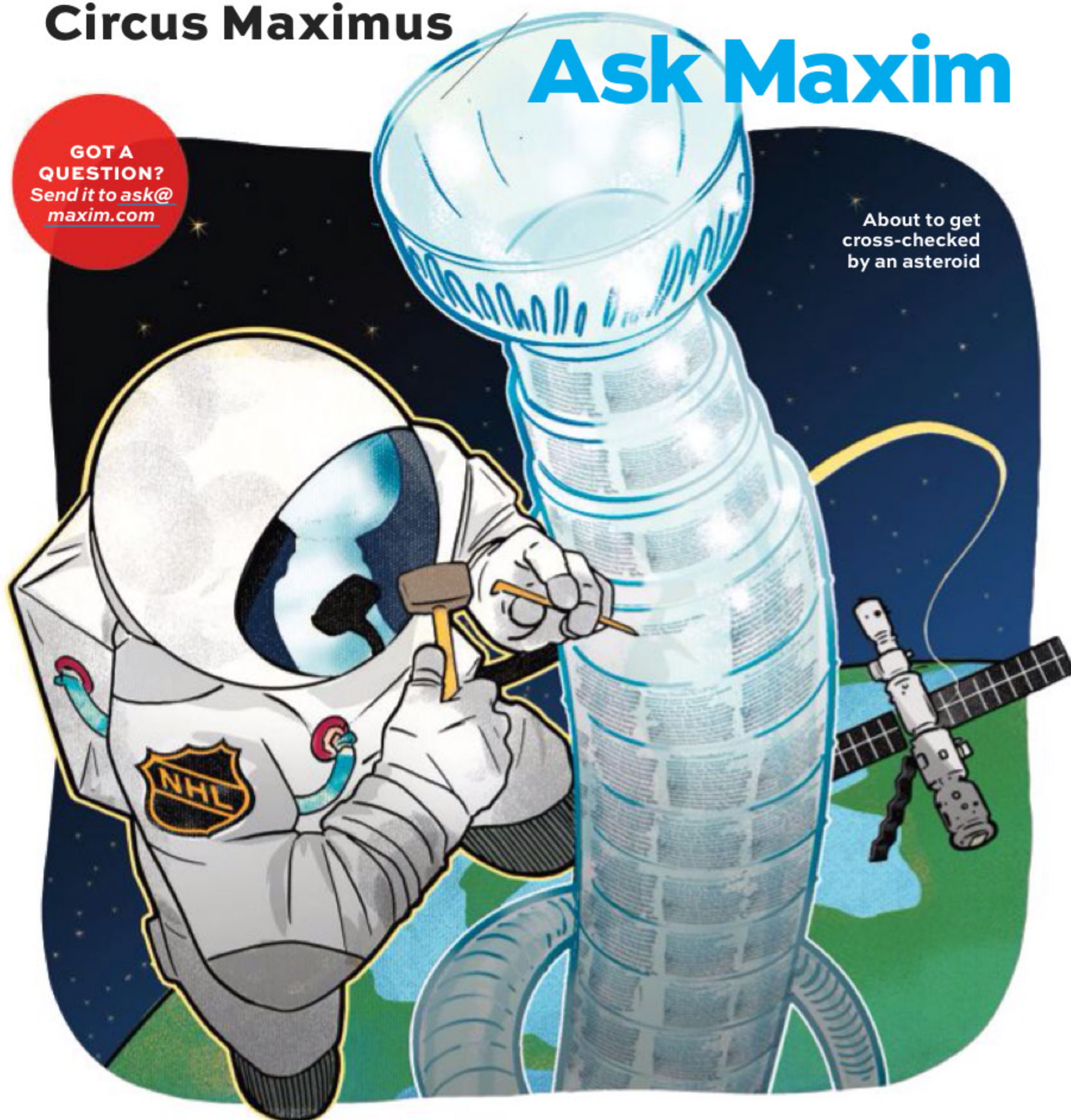

Can water cause allergies?

What's worse than being gluten-free? Having Aquagenic Urticaria. "For those affected, any contact with water causes a hivelike rash," says Marc Leavey, M.D., at Mercy Medical Center in Baltimore. "It's possible that trace impurities in the water, such as chlorine or fluoride, trigger the rash." So stay safe—and never shower again.

Blow Up a Mountain

WILL BARRETT, head of avalanche forecasting at Breckenridge Ski Resort, explains the sweet science of starting avalanches.

ENJOY ICICLES IN YOUR NOSTRILS

"Most of the training is on-the-job—climbing and back-country skiing—and I've seen wind-chills of -100°F at the summit. We breathe weather all season long, so we can predict problems in our snow pack that may cause an avalanche."

KNOW YOUR SNOW

"There are five different classes of avalanche: Class 1 is a small, loose-snow avalanche that won't cause harm; Class 5 would be the entire mountain releasing all the way to the ground. We record 125 to 150 avalanches that are Class 2 or above every year."

THEN BLOW IT UP

"When we see risky snow layers, we bring in the explosives, mostly two-to five-pound hand charges. We'll ski above the area and toss them 25 to 100 feet into the avalanche path below. We also use big 'Avalaunchers' that fire shots downrange up to 1.25 miles."

PREPARE TO BE BURIED ALIVE

"Another technique is ski cutting. We blow up a spot and then go zigzagging through it on skis, using them as a knife to release the slabs. I've been caught in a few avalanches this way. I've never been buried, but I've been picked up and dragged down a hill."

EMBRACE THE NO-FLY LIST

"We have licenses from the ATF to handle the explosives, but you'll probably want to avoid airport security for a while, since the explosive residue can stay on your body for up to a month"—unless you enjoy full-body cavity searches, that is. —Cameron Berkman

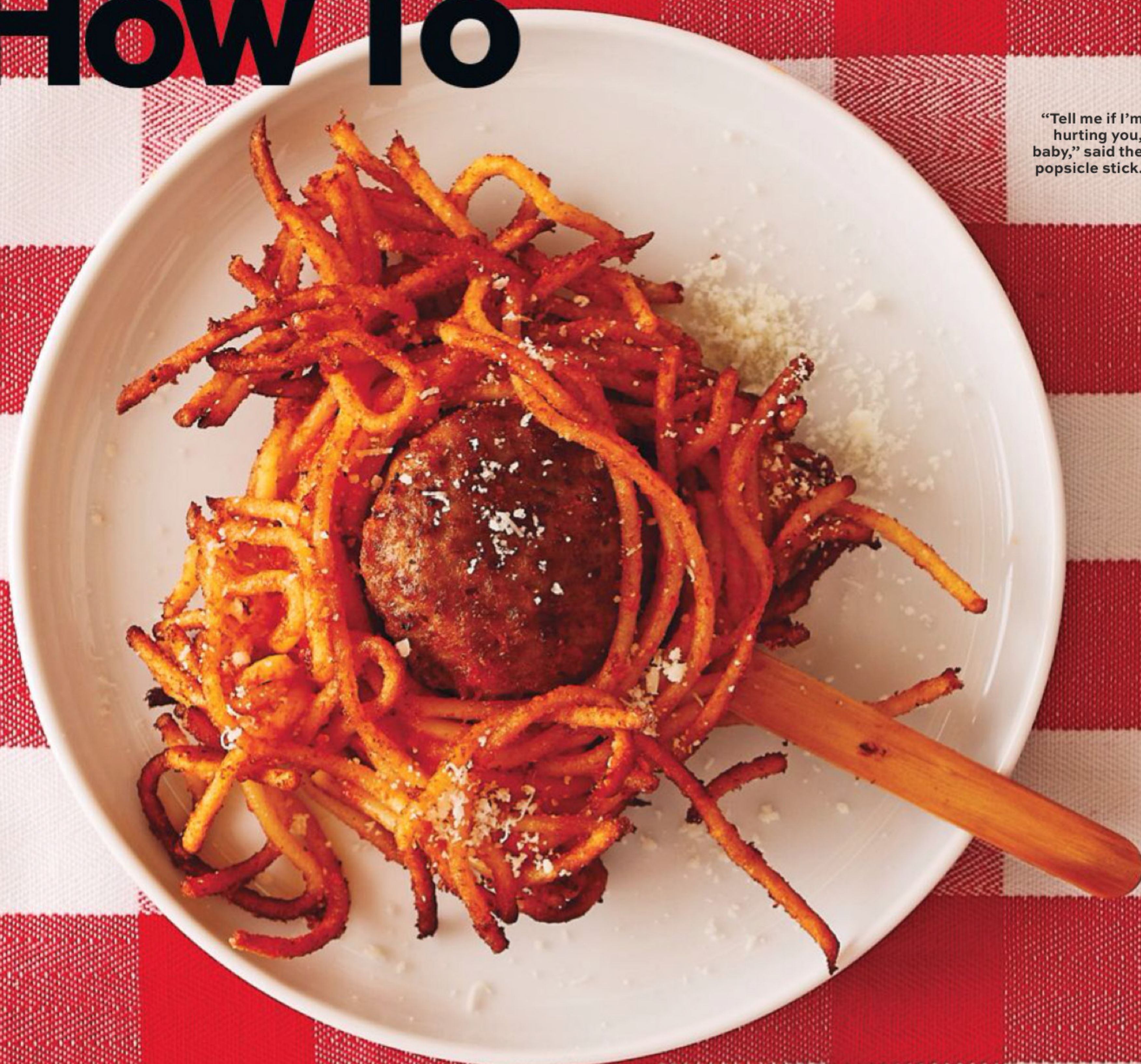

- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 1 egg white
- 2 Tbs. seasoned bread crumbs
- Salt and pepper to taste

FOR THE PASTA

- 5 cups plus 3 Tbs. vegetable oil, divided
- ½ lb. cooked spaghetti
- 2 cups marinara sauce
- 1 cup grated Parmesan
- Salt and pepper

1 Line a baking sheet and a shallow baking dish with parchment paper.

2 Mix the meatball ingredients in a bowl until combined. Shape into eight one-inch balls.

3 Warm 3 Tbs. of the vegetable oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat. Add meatballs and cook, turning to brown on all sides, until just cooked through. Remove from heat and let cool.

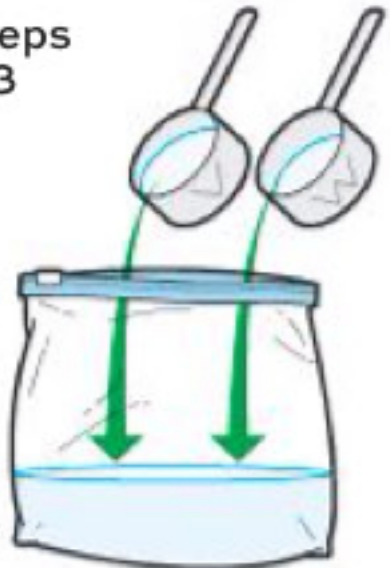
4 Gently toss meatballs, spaghetti, marinara sauce, and Parmesan in a large bowl until thoroughly combined. Place mixture in the prepared baking dish, cover, and refrigerate at least 12 hours or up to overnight.

5 Preheat 5 cups of oil to 350°F in a pot. Cut pasta into eight squares and insert a popsicle stick in each. Place spaghetti sticks in pot, one at a time, and fry seven minutes. Add salt and pepper and serve warm.

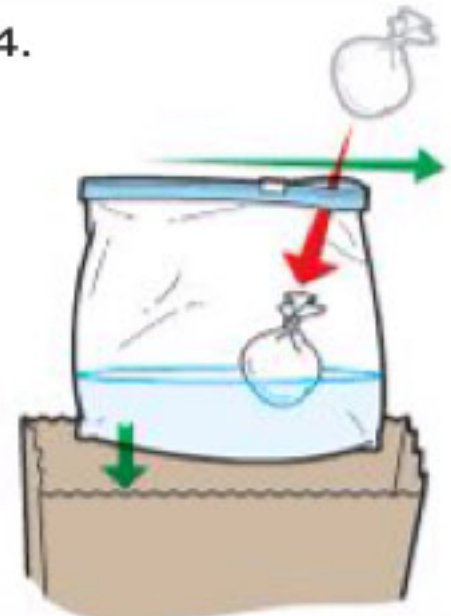

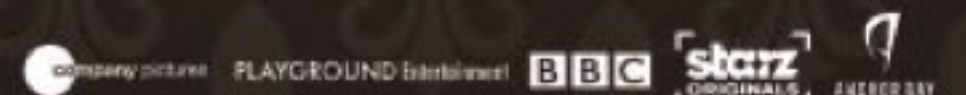

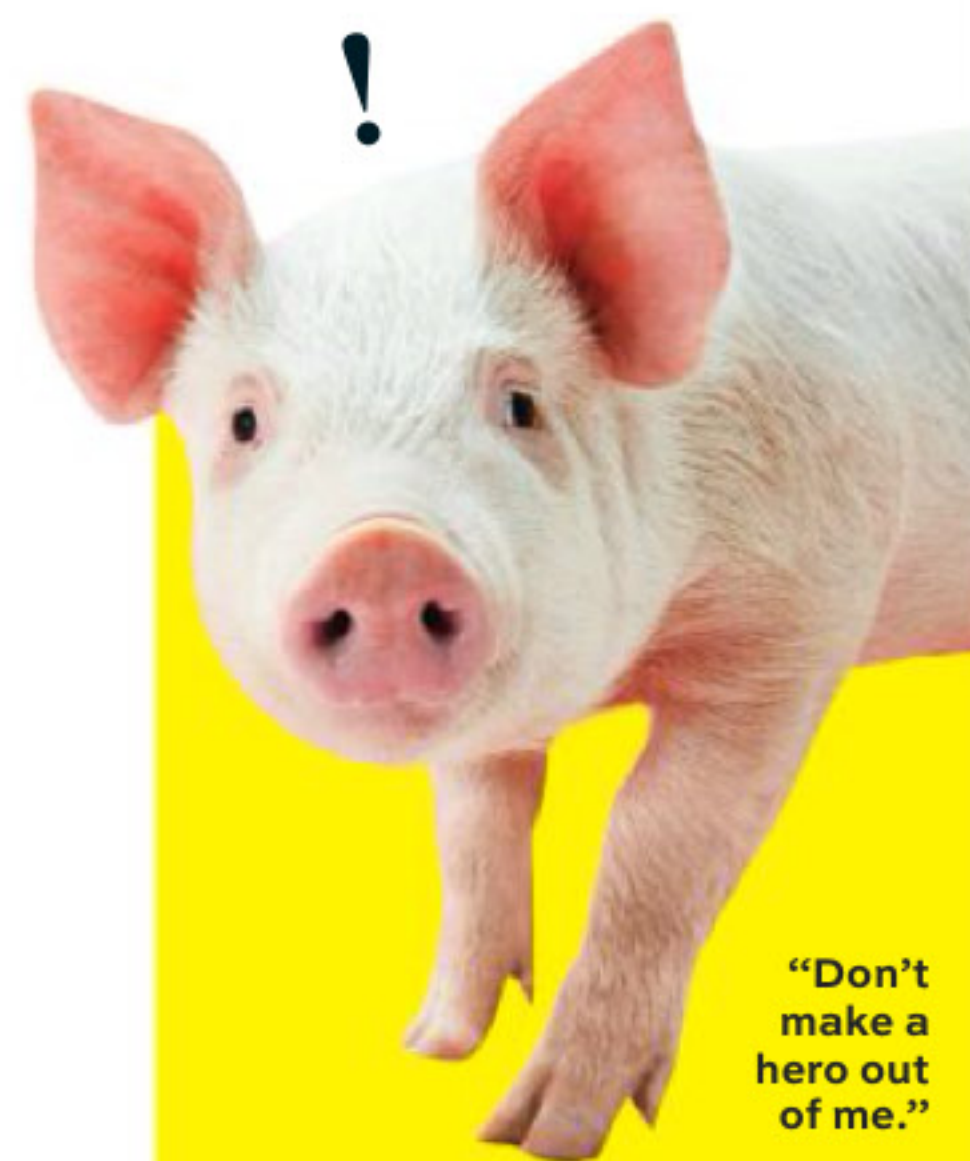

- 1 "Pick a pig. I'm a fan of Ossabaw hogs, which go for \$3 to \$4 a pound. Get a leg with a nice fat cap, which will help it stay moist over curing time, and ask the butcher to remove the hip bone and femoral artery."
- 2 "Combine a few cups of salt and water into a mix to fill open gashes on the leg and cover with a thin layer of salt. Place leg on a sterilized resting rack inside a pan and put it in the fridge. Drain the pan every few days as the leg starts to release liquid. After 25 days, take the leg out and soak in water until all the salt washes off."
- 3 "Place a ham net over the leg and hang it up in a drafty, dark area using twine. After 30 days, rub a lard paste (equal parts lard and rice flour) onto the leg. This will stay on for the entire curing process (about 10 to 12 months, until the leg has lost 30 to 35 percent of its original weight). Then push the paste off with the flat side of a knife and clean leg with red wine vinegar."
- 4 "Cut in fluid motions on either side of the bone and remove skin. Go back and ask your butcher to slice the meat—he may be impressed and do it for free. Finally, enjoy the meats of your labor!"

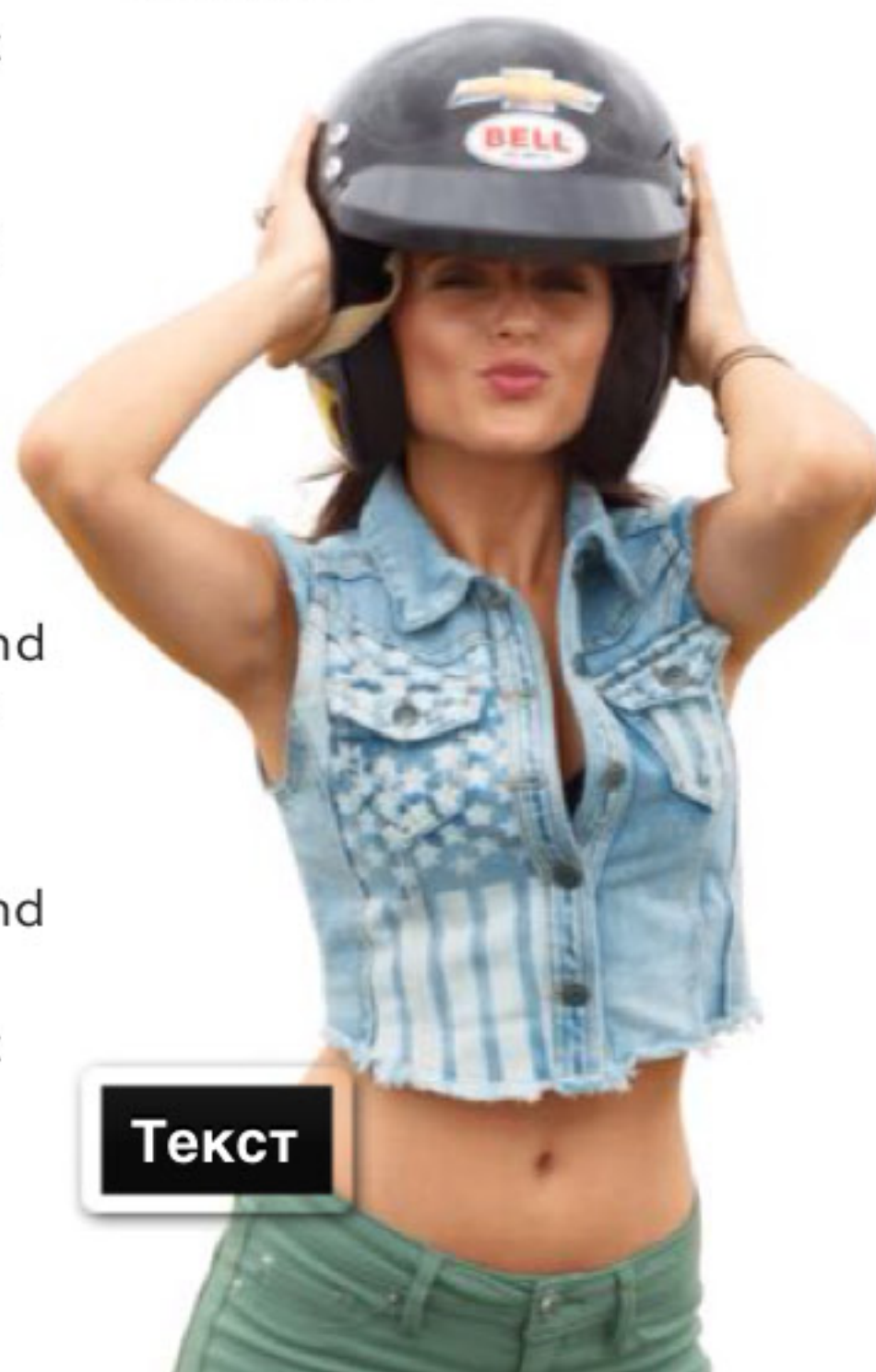

START SHIFTING

"Select first gear to get the car rolling, add some throttle, and speed up to about 15 or 20 mph. Then the clutch goes in, the throttle comes off, and you move the selector from first straight

down to second. As you're releasing the clutch, apply the throttle. Once you've got first to second gear down, then move on to third, fourth, and so on. That's what I did with Marisa, and she got up to speed *real* fast."

How to Break In Your Jeans

Laura Vandervoort first soared into our homes in 2007 as *Smallville*'s smokin' Kara Zor-El, a.k.a. Supergirl. That's enough to secure anyone a spot in the geek hall of fame, but Laura sealed the deal in 2009 with the role of a smokin' lizard princess invading Earth in the reboot of the '80s cult classic *V*. With sci-fi chops like that, it's no wonder she's the lead licker in *Bitten*, Syfy's gritty take on werewolves, in which she plays the only female werewolf in the world. (Who, coincidentally, is also smokin'.)

Congrats on your first Maxim cover! We heard it was pretty cold on set. Thank you! We actually didn't have to go outside

until the very end, and people were hugging me with blankets. They set up the camera, I ran out, dropped the blanket, and we shot.

Could you tell us a little bit about *Bitten*?

I play Elena Michaels, the only female werewolf in existence. She's the only female to survive the werewolf transformation, because it's so excruciating. Your bones are breaking and snapping and contorting, and it's just horrible.

You get to kick some ass on the show. Did you have any prior fight training? I have a second-degree black belt in Shotokan karate.

You have a go-to move? No, but the bo staff is my favorite weapon. So we

incorporated that into the finale. Our stunt coordinator said, "You're gonna grab a weapon." And I said, "Well, I'd love for it to be a bo."

Between your stints on *Smallville*, *V*, and now *Bitten*, you have a pretty devoted sci-fi fan base. What's the wildest fan experience you've had? At Comic-Con I've met fans who have tattoos on their arms of my face as Supergirl. I signed one guy's arm, and he came back an hour later and had gotten it tattooed.

What about embarrassing moments?

I did a morning show to promote *V*, and after talking about how I really wanted to be taken seriously as an actor, the *V* clip they showed was me taking off my clothes without speaking. I just put my head on the desk and said, "I honestly do speak on the show. I promise!"

With the *Superman* franchise rebooted on the big screen, what would you say if you got the call to don the Supergirl outfit again?

Yes! I get a lot of tweets asking if I'm gonna be in them. I haven't heard anything. There are lots of girls out there who I'm sure would also love to do it, but she's very close to my heart.

You also dipped into comedy to work with Seth MacFarlane on *Ted* and *Family Guy*. How was that?

We did *Ted* in Boston, and Mark Wahlberg was actually my first crush growing up, so to work with him was pretty

amazing. I was just trying to keep my shit together.

In the *Bitten* pilot, you very impressively devour a Cinnabon. Is the werewolf appetite a recurring theme?

Yeah, the producers thought it was so great to show Elena constantly scarfing food down. We have this scene where the entire pack sits down to breakfast. We did so many takes where they wanted us scarfing everything down that by the end the guys had the meat sweats.

You're from Toronto. How much hockey knowledge must one have to impress a Canadian girl?

I can't speak for every Canadian girl, but I'm a fan. I follow the Maple Leafs. But you don't need knowledge. You just have to be a nice guy!

Since you play a female werewolf, got tips on dating one of those?

Just bring a slab of red meat and you're good!

The show takes place partially in Toronto, and it seems like almost every person there is incredibly good-looking. Is that just how it is in Canada?

Again, I can't speak for every Canadian. You can ask Justin Bieber. He seems to like to speak for everyone.

The werewolves from *Bitten*, *True Blood*, *Twilight*, and the 1980s' *Teen Wolf* all meet in a dark alley. Who wins?

The werewolves from *Bitten*. But Michael J. Fox would join our cast, and we'd kick ass. 🐾

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

How did this show come about?

My photos always pop up on the “Rich Kids of Instagram” Tumblr, so the producers found me through that. I brought Morgan with me to the casting, and everything just took off from there.

"WAKE THE FUCK UP, JABRONI!"

shouts the Iron Sheik. It's lunchtime at his manager's house in Toronto, and the Sheik is working. We're at a kitchen table littered with plates of Persian food, a pack of Camel Filters, four empty cans of Coors Light, one bottle of Glenrothes whisky, and a gold-plated microphone.

To the Sheik's right, a twentysomething computer programmer adjusts the mike. To the Sheik's left, Brutus "the Barber" Beefcake, a 6'4" ex-wrestler, passes the time rolling a joint and occasionally interrupting the Sheik's takes. The sound bites are being recorded for a smartphone app called the Iron Sheik Alarm Clock. If you watched his merciless ringside rants in the 1980s or more recently heard his uncensored tirades on *The Howard Stern Show*, in person the Sheik is somehow even more deafening. A hefty, thick-necked 72-year-old with a heavy Middle Eastern accent, he speaks with a booming, syncopated cadence that suggests he needs both anger management training and a hearing aid.

"Monday? FUCK THE MONDAY!"

"Good morning, YOU FUCKING JABRONI!"

"Download my app OR GO FUCK YOURSELF!"

These lines are fed to the Sheik by his managers, a pair of 34-year-old identical Persian twins named Page and Jian Magen, who have recently revitalized the Sheik's career. The app is their idea—as is the Sheik's trip to Toronto: In the span of 96 hours, he'll be honored/lambasted at two comedy roasts headlined by

Gilbert Gottfried; he'll sign hundreds of head shots and pose for photos at two VIP meet-and-greets; he'll shoot a spec TV commercial for Bud Light in which he arm-wrestles a blonde actress in a pizza parlor; he'll film his final interview for the documentary *Iranian Legend: The Iron Sheik Story*, which premieres next month; he'll storm Mayor Rob Ford's office in Toronto and hijack a gaggle of TV news crews. Video of him insulting the politician—"The man eats a cheeseburger and smokes crack!!!"—will go viral.

Which brings us to the Sheik's Twitter account. What started as a shits-and-giggles experiment has introduced the Iron Sheik to an audience beyond wrestling. Today getting heckled by @the_Iron-sheik has become, in some strange way, a testament to a celebrity's relevance. No one is off-limits. Nothing is sacred.

With more than 360,000 followers, his comeback is pretty remarkable.

"Save it for later!" Jian says as the Sheik pours more whiskey.

"You trying to insult the legend?!" barks the Sheik, unleashing a grin that exposes his Chiclet-size chompers. "You think I can't handle it?!"

"Just sip it," pleads Jian, before telling me, "It's gonna be a wild night. Fun for Sheik. Fun for fans. Crazy for us."

left Iran because he feared he was going to be murdered. Takhti, a stout middleweight with a jet-black pompadour, had won Olympic gold in 1956. Inspired by his hero, Vaziri would wake up at 4 A.M. to run in the mountains near Tehran. Eventually, he told himself, he too would be a champion.

One day the phone rang—Takhti was being rushed to the hospital. When Vaziri arrived, he was sent to the cemetery. As Takhti's body was washed on a stone altar, Vaziri stood there and wept.

Takhti's death was declared a suicide, but many suspected his democratic leanings had put the wrestler in the crosshairs of the SAVAK, Iran's secret police, who were infamous for torture and executions. "They tell me, 'If you don't want to be like him,'" Vaziri recalls, "better don't say nothing."

Vaziri hopped a plane to New York, then Minnesota, where the U.S. Olympic wrestling coach hired him as an assistant to the University of Minnesota team. Vaziri spoke only Farsi. He learned English by watching *The Tonight Show* and *Sesame Street*. With Vaziri's help, the Minnesota Amateur Wrestling Club won three consecutive AAU championships. In 1971 Vaziri himself won AAU gold; his medal was presented to him by Muhammad Ali. The following year Vaziri traveled to the Munich Olympics but couldn't compete: He had a green card but not U.S. citizenship, so he sat on the bench as an assistant coach.

Back in Minneapolis, Vaziri had been following the American Wrestling Association on TV. "I say, 'Wow, this is different than my wrestling,'" says Vaziri. "It look like entertainment." Between coaching and working as a welder, he was broke. "I saw lot of professional wrestlers drive Cadillac," he says. "And I said, 'Wow! I'm a real all-American gold medal, and I don't drive Cadillac.'"

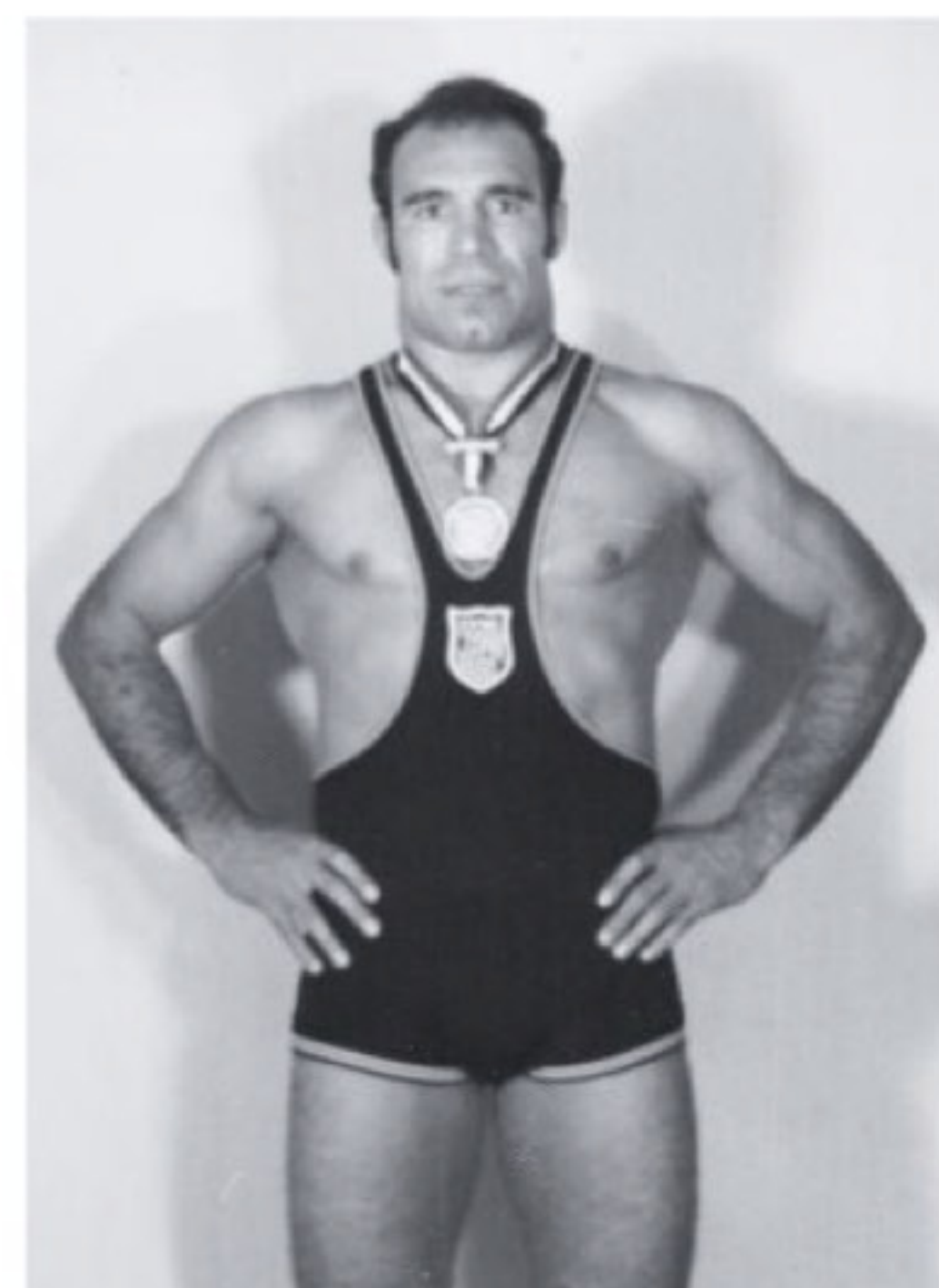
In 1973 Vaziri attended the AWA training camp beside

future star Ric Flair. Three years later it all clicked.

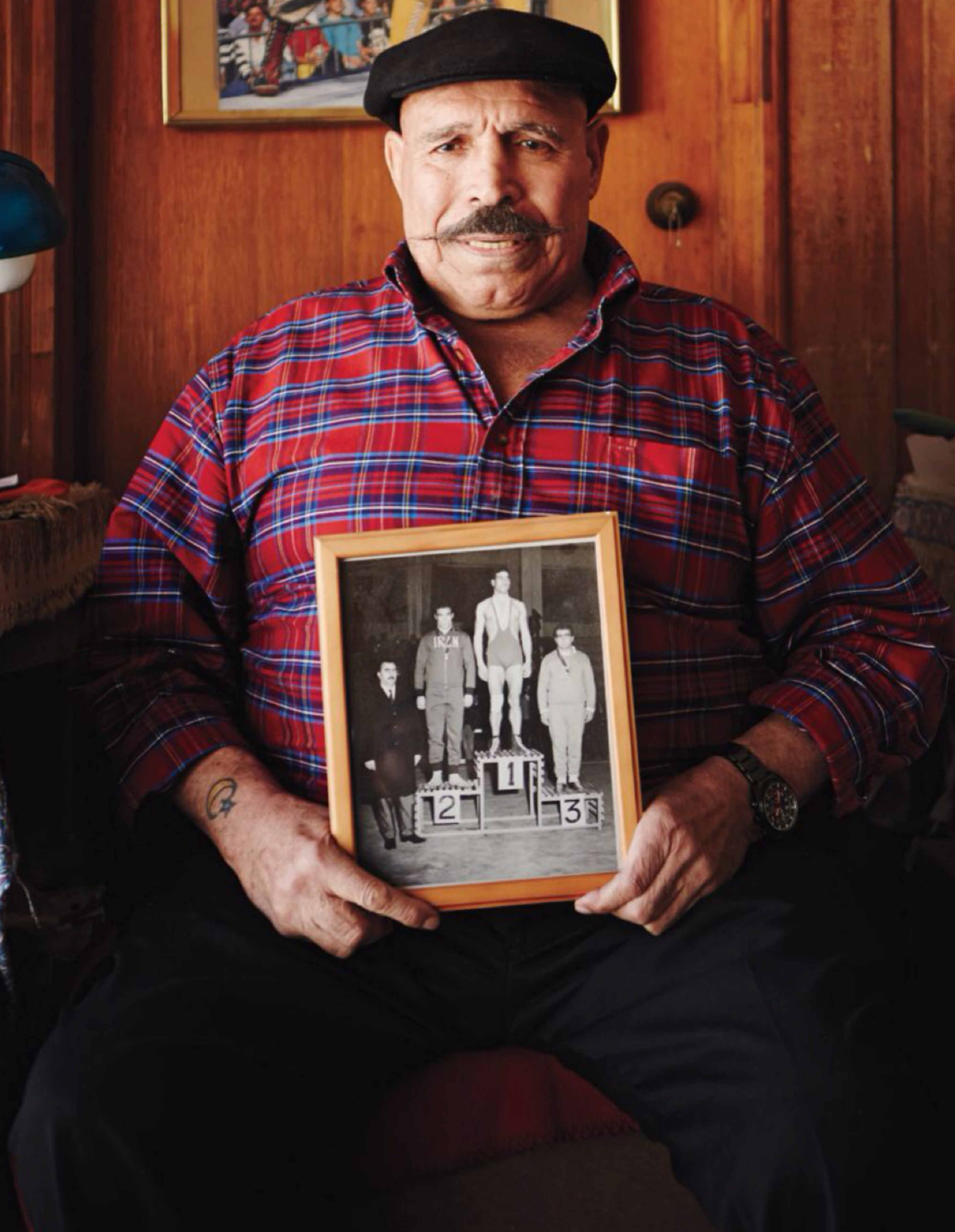

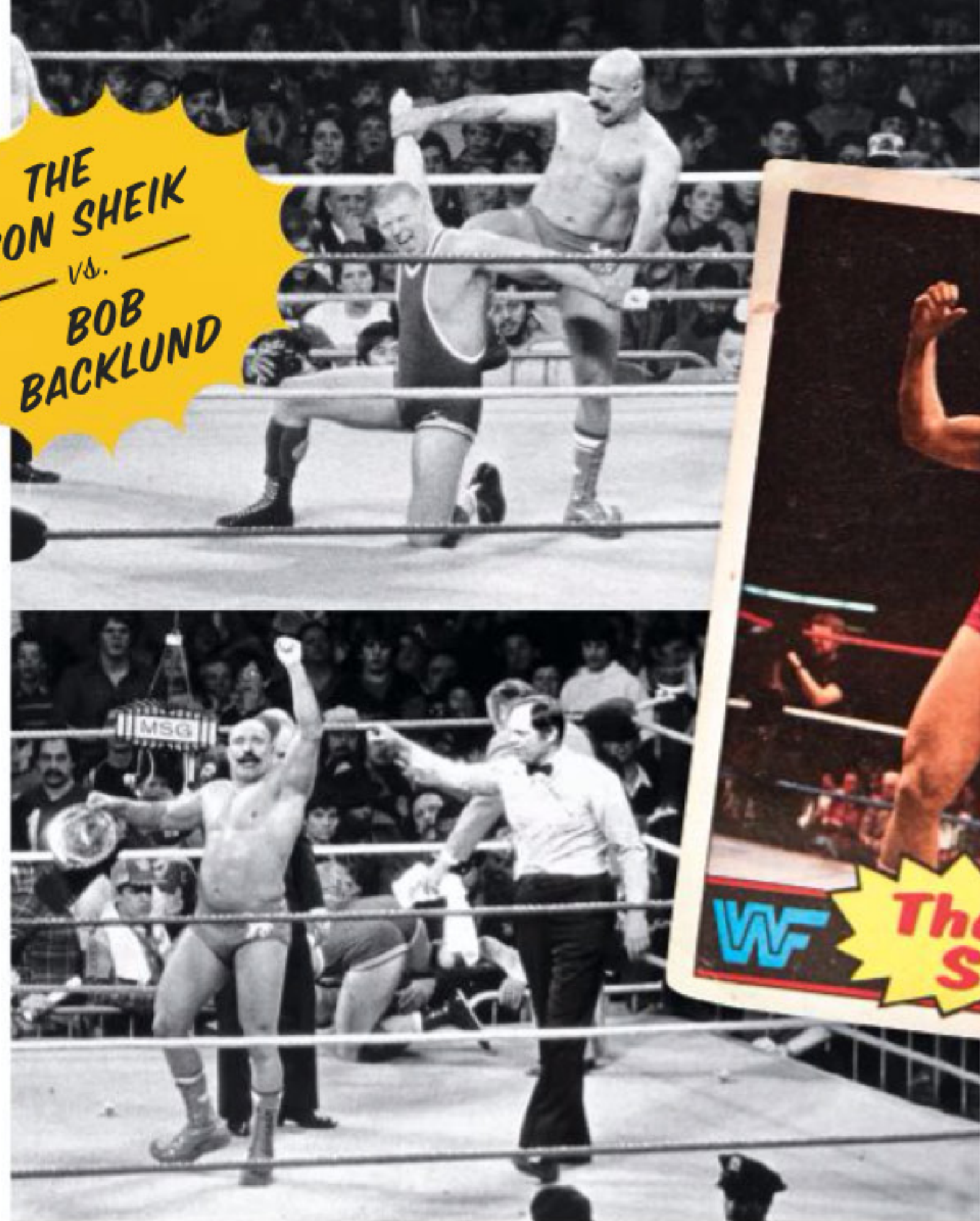

suggested the name the Iron Sheik. He shaved his head and grew the lustrous lip caterpillar he's had ever since.

Then in 1979 came the hostage crisis in Iran. "It was just the right time to establish my gimmick to be the real baddest, baddest wrestler in the universe," says Vaziri. "I had the most heat of any human being!" While 52 Americans were held captive for 444 days, Vaziri continued taunting crowds and flying the Iranian flag. He rode the wave to Madison Square Garden, where in 1983 he defeated WWF champ Bob Backlund. Four weeks later the Iron Sheik lost his belt to an up-and-comer named Hulk Hogan. "He was the springboard for Hulkamania," says Hogan. "From his face, his mustache, the boots, the tights that said Iran on them, the way he talked...everything was on the money."

As the Cold War heightened, so too did the Sheik's profile. Teamed with "Russian" wrestler Nikolai Volkoff, the Sheik would yell, "Iran No. 1! Russia No. 1! U.S.A...." and spit. Crowds went ape-shit. Vaziri had transformed himself into the most hated man in wrestling. There were Iron Sheik action figures, T-shirts, trading cards, and posters. Vaziri enjoyed his fame. Maybe too much.

heels (bad guys).

"I want to be a villain," Vaziri told his boss, Verne Gagne, the legendary trainer and owner of AWA. Gagne's wife

"I PAY MY DUES AND IT COST ME million million dollars," declares Vaziri, sitting beside a stack of Iron Sheik head shots and a Sharpie.

The "it" that cost him millions is May 26, 1987—the day the Iron Sheik and his "nemesis," Hacksaw Jim Duggan, were pulled over by a New Jersey state trooper. Never mind that they'd been drinking a six-pack of St. Pauli Girl. Or that Duggan had five or six joints under his seat. As Duggan recounts in his autobiography, the troopers found two grams of cocaine in the Sheik's "man-purse" and another gram in his wallet.

The Sheik was arraigned. Duggan posted bond. Somehow they made it to their match, but it didn't matter. Word was out: Wrestling, the bust revealed, is so fake even fierce rivals party together.

WWF chairman Vince McMahon fired them both. The Sheik picked up a contract with the World Championship Wrestling for a couple hundred thousand dollars—a fraction of his WWF salary. His wife nearly left him. He attended rehab and cleaned up for a month before his old habits crept back.

Before coming to America, Vaziri was a devout Muslim who didn't drink alcohol, let alone touch drugs. All that changed when he became a pro wrestler. "The boys said, 'Sheik, have one beer with us.' I try to be social," recalls Vaziri. "If I didn't become wrestler, I probably didn't have that problem."

Sheik and the boys would wrestle 300 nights a year, and blowing off steam was the norm. "You're a celebrity. You're

a star. And everywhere we go, they're waiting," Vaziri says of fans eager to party with the Sheik. "Sometimes I say no. Sometimes I say yes."

Ultimately it was wrestler Junkyard Dog who introduced Vaziri to crack. "He my friend. But he no perfect," says Vaziri. He tried rehab again in 2000 and stayed sober for six months.

By 2001 pro wrestling was in ruins. McMahon had purchased WCW, his biggest competitor, effectively seizing a monopoly. "When Vince had everybody by the balls," says Beefcake, "he began squeezing the pay down more and more." (McMahon declined to comment.)

"It's the only job I've done my whole life," says Vaziri. "It's hard to all of sudden give up or quit."



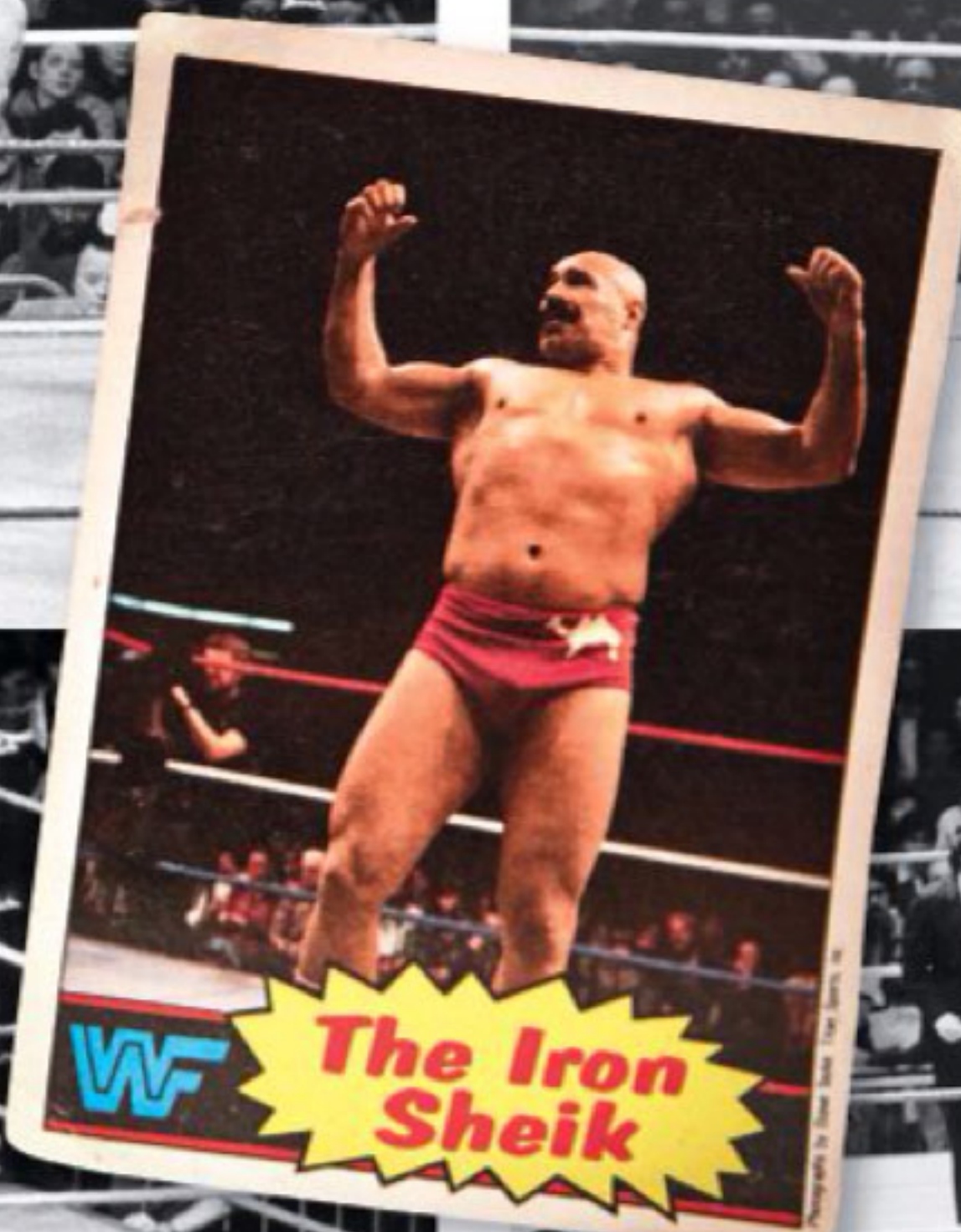

Page and Jian Magen were watching wrestling when suddenly a man's voice swearing in Farsi startled their mom.

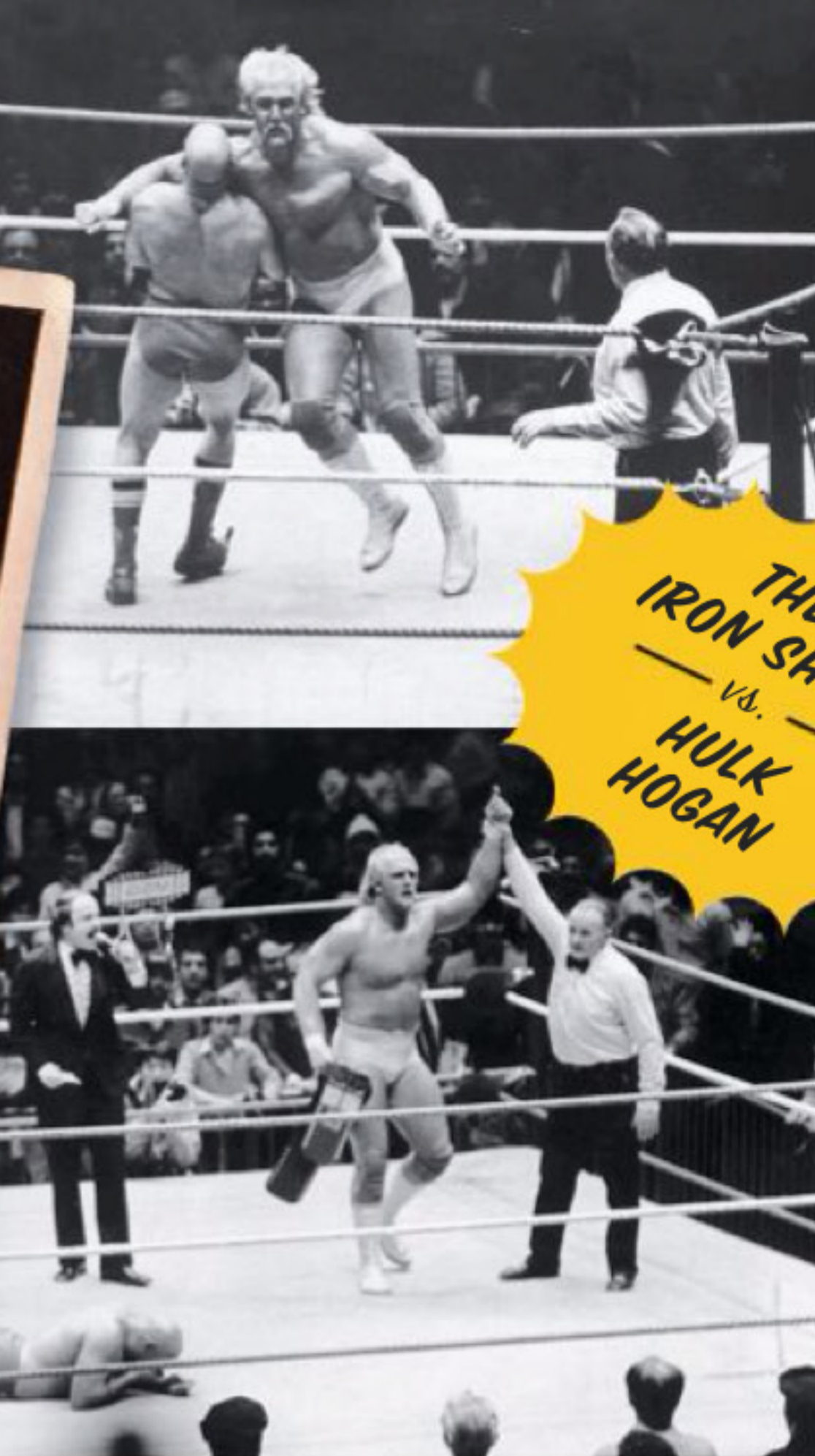
"That's your daddy's friend!" she yelled. The boys' father and Vaziri had bonded when they were teen hopefuls; their father was once Iran's national Ping-Pong champion. When Vaziri moved to America, they lost touch.

Eventually the boys met the Iron Sheik when he wrestled at Toronto's 16,485-capacity Maple Leaf Gardens. Backstage the Sheik introduced his "nephews" to his coworkers: Andre the Giant! Macho Man! King Kong Bundy!

From then on, whenever the Sheik wrestled in Toronto, the twins attended.

Afterward he'd accompany them home, where their mother prepared a colossal Persian feast. Over the next four years, Sheik brought a rotating cast of dinner guests to the Magens', including Nikolai Volkoff, Jake "the Snake" Roberts, and Greg "the Hammer" Valentine.

"We didn't get that it was an act!" laughs Page. "This was a part of our national pride, which is also a mind-fuck because the white kids are like, 'Fuck him, he's a murderer!'"

When their mom heard about the Sheik's arrest, she put her foot down. "Don't see him again!" she declared. Fast-forward to 1998, when the brothers (then 19-year-old party promoters) spotted a flyer for an independent wrestling show. When the twins arrived, they couldn't believe their eyes. Inside a run-down bar, 86 people were watching the Iron Sheik battle Abdullah the Butcher in a brawl as bloody as a scene from the Mickey Rourke film *The Wrestler*.

As the years passed, Vaziri's physical injuries started taking a toll. He self-medicated. He appeared on *The Jerry Springer Show*, then joined Howard Stern's "Wack Pack," where his uncensored rants made him a fan favorite.

In 2006 the twins traveled to Vaziri's home outside Atlanta to work on a film about the Sheik. A few years prior one of his daughters had been murdered by

her boyfriend. Vaziri was devastated.

"He was in a dark place," recalls Jian.

Then, in 2009, two things happened:

1. The Sheik quit hard drugs cold turkey. "I stopped the bad stuff. I'm not interested anymore," explains Vaziri.

2. The twins created the Sheik's Twitter account, which has led to #team-sheikie T-shirts, mustache necklaces, and baby onesies. For \$30 he'll verbally bash anyone you want on Twitter. (The twins tweet for the Sheik. "He's never turned on a computer in his life!" says Jian.)

"He's built like a Studebaker. He'll go for a long time, but not forever," says Page. "I want to find a way to make the Sheik live on. It's got to live forever."



ON MY LAST EVENING WITH THE Iron Sheik, we all pile into a black Yukon and drive to a 526-capacity bar in Hamilton, Ontario, an hour southwest of Toronto. The Sheik rides shotgun, chastising our driver while the radio blasts the Clash's "Rock the Casbah."

After we pull into the parking lot, an excited fan passes by and offers the legend a joint. Page forbids it.

"Fuck you! I sell out Madison Square Garden! Don't you tell me what I can do!" the Sheik yells, deadpan.

"You think Lady Gaga does that?! Or Jay Z?! You can't do that!" Page protests.

"Unbelievable!" shouts Sheik.

Sometimes it's hard to tell where Vaziri ends and the Sheik begins.

"He just lives it, 24 hours a day," says Hogan. "He'll work that gimmick till the wheels fall off. It keeps him alive."

Earlier that day, while Brutus Beefcake is taking a nap on the couch, Vaziri asks me to help him prep for the roast. He grabs my arm, and we amble gingerly down the hall into Jian's den, where the Sheik sleeps on a blowup mattress. I hand Vaziri his black slacks: waist size 52. I guide his arms into the sleeves of a blue dress shirt, then a black sport coat. I drape two medals over his head—Vaziri's 1971 AAU gold and the Sheik's 2005 WWE Hall of Fame award—and then straighten his headdress. He takes out a toothbrush and vigorously brushes his mustache before twisting both ends with his fingers.

"I love you forever, bubba," he says.

That night in Hamilton, 100 fans take turns professing the same to Sheik. "Tonight is the best night of my life. I got to meet you. You are a true legend," one wasted dude slurs. It's heartwarming. That said, it's also pleasing to watch the world's greatest heel and Twitter F-bomber get a taste of his own medicine during both Canadian roasts.

"The Sheik's life has been no fucking picnic. Don't be fooled by that tablecloth on his head," says Jesse Joyce, who wrote Seth MacFarlane's jokes for the 85th Academy Awards.

"He was gonna be the Ayatollah in *The Wrestler*, but he snorted all his lines," teases comedian Mike Lawrence.

"We're roasting him tonight and cremating him together in a month," smirks Tony Hinchcliffe, staff writer for *The Comedy Central Roast of James Franco*.

Sheik retorts, enraged...but not upset.

"You can go FUCK YOURSELF!" he shouts, before turning to the crowd and smiling. "Gimme a HELL, YEAH!" 🍌

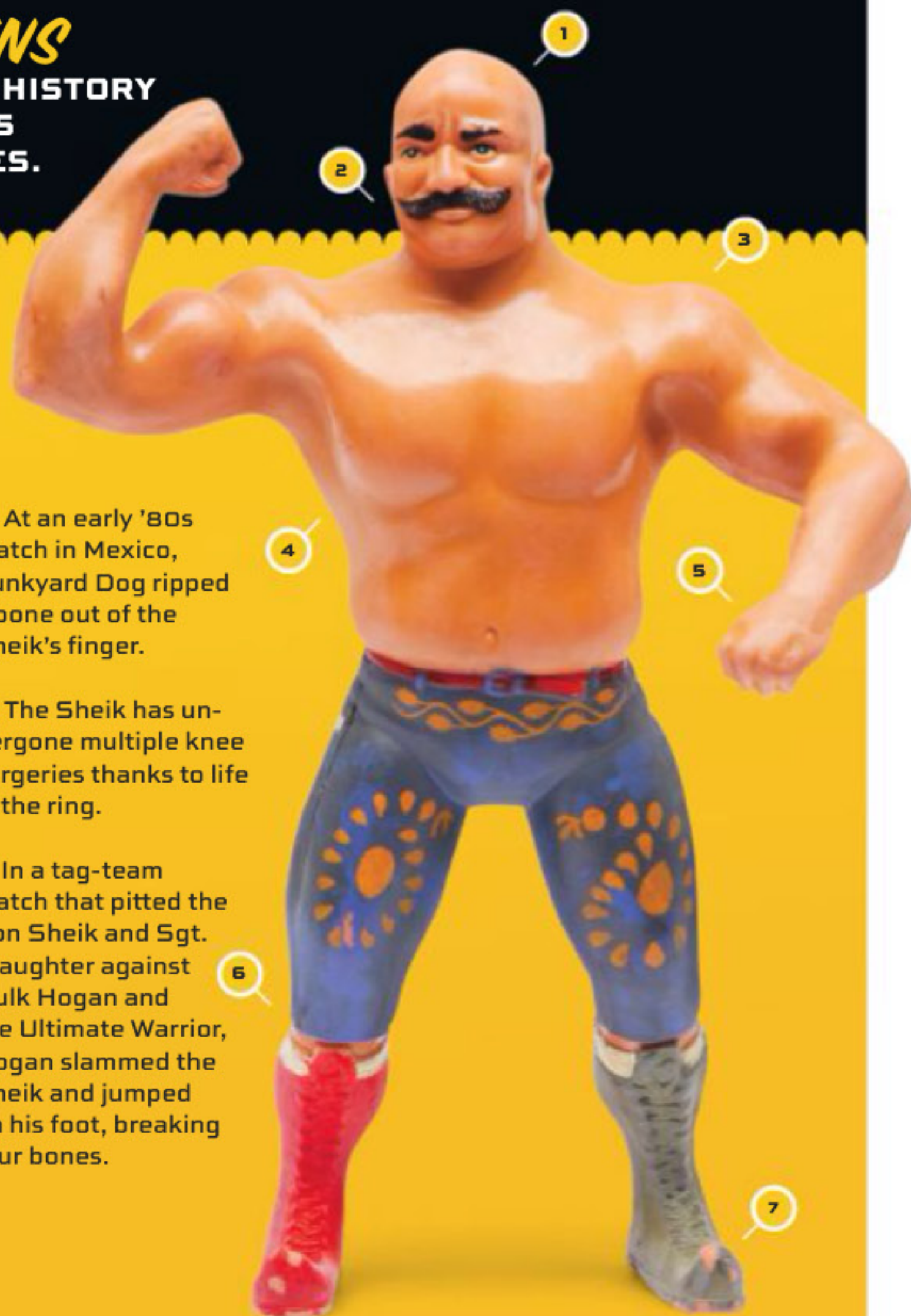

Each year 140 million Americans enter a March Madness pool. Sure, the chances of filling out a perfect bracket are 147,000,000,000,000,000-1, but follow these tips and you will at least have a chance of taking your coworkers to the cleaners. Let the madness begin!

[MO' MONEY REGION]

1 WINNING BIG

Here's a good rule: Dominant teams dominate! So schools that crush foes in the regular season tend to do so in the big dance. "If you look at the ultimate champion, their scoring average is usually between five and eight points better than the rest of the field's," says Peter Tiernan of BracketScience.com. In other words, it doesn't matter who wins; it matters who wins by a lot.

8 MASCOT MADNESS

Push numbers aside and pick your victors based on which team's mascot would win in a fight. Just don't expect it to work. Last year's Final Four were the Orange, the Wolverines, the Cardinals, and the Shockers (really). By this logic, you'd pick the Wolverines, right? But alas, the Cardinals took the title, which means this strategy is bogus or that wolverines are total pussies.

2 STAR POWER

Cinderella stories are great, but if you want to win your office pool, look for teams with at least one elite talent. Remember, legends like Bill Russell, Magic Johnson, and Michael Jordan all led their schools to titles. As gambling guru RJ Bell of Pregame.com points out, "The best players step up their games when the lights are brightest." So make like Casey Kasem and reach for the stars!

7 THE "WINNERS" CIRCLE

Is being a "winner" endemic? Sure, there are a number of players who have won at both the college and professional levels (see left), so you might think players who won big in high school or AAU tournaments would have what it takes to win in March. Well, not necessarily, although ultracompetitive types, like Trey Burke last year or Kemba Walker in 2011, tend to rise to the occasion.

3 ROAD WARRIORS

Winning before a home crowd is great, but once March Madness arrives those Cameron Crazies aren't going to do Duke much good. "Basically every tournament game is on the road," notes Tim Chartier, an associate professor of mathematics at Davidson. "So teams don't have a home-field advantage." The bottom line? Look for the squads with the happiest EZ Pass.

6 THE COSTANZA THEORY

You remember the *Seinfeld* episode (or at least you should): George decides to go against his better judgment and do the opposite of his instincts. "You don't want to pick a 16 to beat a one, but this works for an eight versus a nine—traditionally more of the latter advance," says Bell. So is this a good strategy? Not really. Which means yes, definitely.

4 THE POWER OF THREE

Teams that rely on three-pointers are hit or miss, literally. If they get hot, they're tough to beat, but if they go cold, they go home. "It's a high-risk, high-reward play," says Tiernan. "So teams that shot a high percentage of threes have a propensity for upsets." If you're looking for underdogs in your bracket, squads that excel—or jack it up a ton—from long range are a solid bet.

5 THE YOUNG ONES

It's tough to recall a season in which freshmen dominated the game quite like this one, but that's not a guarantee of anything in March. Last year John Calipari's frosh-heavy Kentucky squad didn't even make the tournament. "Calipari has defined his program by bringing in young talent," says Tiernan. "But last year was a good demonstration of how it can fail."

[MAKE IT RAIN REGION]

1 WHO'S THE BOSS

As Tiernan notes, "Coaching experience is critical in making a deep run in the tournament. Since 2000 every single championship coach has had at least three trips under his belt and at least one Elite Eight run." In college basketball, as in so many other aspects of life, success breeds success, so your Coach Ks, Pitinos, Caliparis, and Izzos have a good chance to go deep.

8 THE BLUES

Picking winners based on their uniforms is the kind of strategy someone who watches more *Project Runway* than *SportsCenter* might employ. Although if you *had* to pick one color, blue isn't a terrible choice: Last year Louisville was the first champ without blue in its uniform in a decade. Powerhouses like Duke, UNC, Kansas, and UConn all rock it, so don't be afraid of a little blue ball.

2 THE HOT STAY HOT

The truth is, teams with a hot hand at the end of the regular season—and especially teams that win their conference titles—tend to stay hot. Last year Louisville won the Big East tournament before taking the NCAA title, and in 2011 UConn did the same. In fact, there have been only five champions in the past 15 years who failed to win their conference championships. Winners win!

VS

7 FOLLOWING THE LEADER

As it turns out, our president is pretty boring when it comes to March Madness. Chartier's studies show that Obama's been successful some years and not so much in others. In the end, copying his bracket is kind of a cop-out and not all that different from just going with the favorites: In 2011 his Final Four were all number-one seeds. You read it here first: Obama is a conservative!

3 THE EASY WAY OUT

If you simply make your picks based on the higher seed...you'll probably do well, especially in a small pool. "The truth is, very few people really know how to fill out every single game in a bracket, so this strategy is easy," says Chartier. But while a number one has never lost to a 16, there are *always* a few upsets. The bottom line, though, is: It's boring, and life is too boring to be boring.

6 HOME AWAY FROM HOME

As we've noted, all games in the tournament are essentially away games, or at least neutral-court games. Except...that's not *exactly* true. "The year Davidson went to the Elite Eight, our first game was in Raleigh, North Carolina, and a lot of fans went because it was so close," says Chartier. So if Memphis is playing near Memphis, a win (as well as delicious barbecue) is pretty likely.

4 TENACIOUS D

If you're looking for Cinderellas, it's worth considering a team's ability to force turnovers. "These are road games, and shooting can be a challenge at these venues," says Bell. "There's an old saying: Defense travels well. So teams that can lock down their opponents have an even greater margin for success in the tournament than they do in the regular season."

VS

5 SMALL WONDERS

Increasingly, it's guard-driven teams that succeed in March, especially guards who drive the paint. Last year's tournament is a prime example, with the Russ Smith-led Cardinals defeating the Trey Burke-led Wolverines in the final. "In the '80s the average team got 40 percent of its points from guards," says Tiernan. "Now teams get 60 percent of their points from guards."

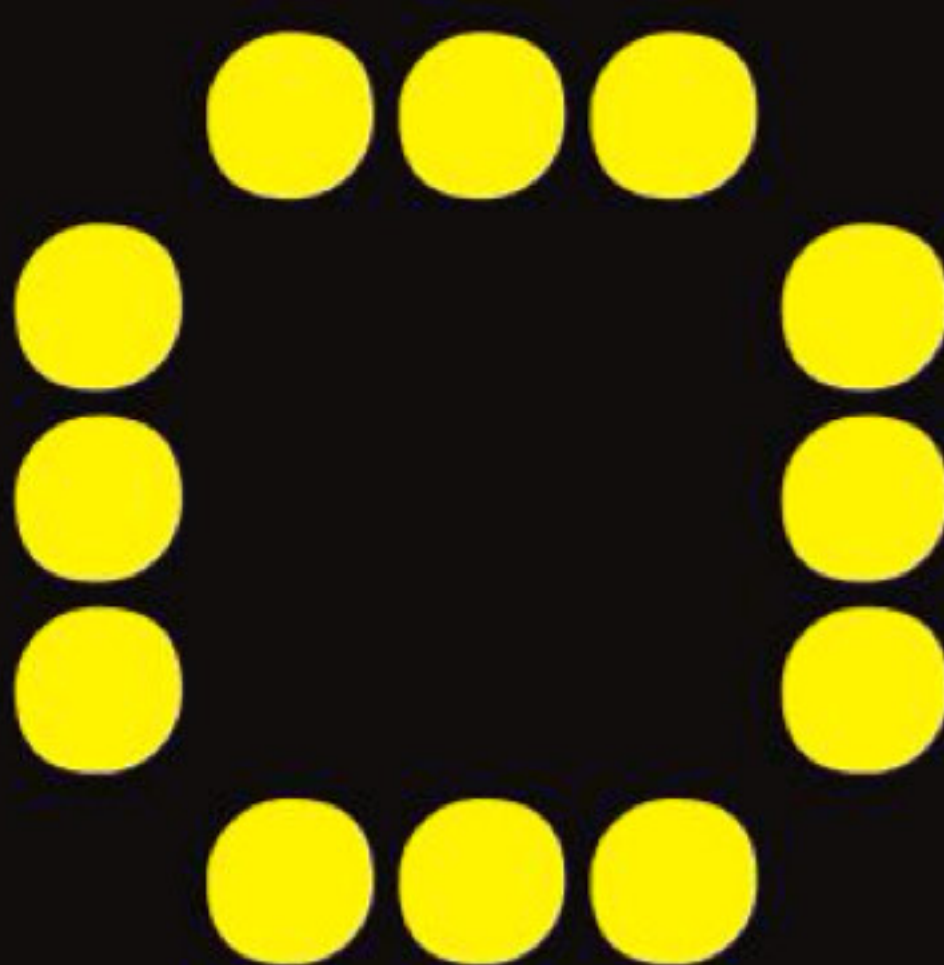
Before there
was Google Glass,
there was...

The cyborg

< STEVE MANN

has been melding biology and technology for three decades: man and machine, with himself as guinea pig. Now, with “smart” glasses poised to change the way we see the world, will he finally get his due?

One summer night in Paris not long ago, Steve Mann took his wife and kids to the McDonald's near the Champs-Élysées.

"Normally we'd be looking for some fine cuisine," he recalls, "but the kids saw the McDonald's arches and they already made up their minds."

They were in the midst of a busy two-week vacation, and after another long day of sight-seeing—a river cruise, eight museums—they were hungry.

As Mann waited in line to order, a clean-cut McDonald's worker in a button-up blue shirt and tie asked him about his unusual eyewear: a narrow aluminum headband with a tiny computer lens fixed

snugly against his right eye. Mann, a gangly, balding 50-year-old inventor, gets this question a lot because, for the past 34 years, he's been living as a cyborg.

After decades of being a sci-fi fantasy, the age of cyborgs is dawning. For most people this means anticipating the year's game-changing arrival of Google Glass, the sleek eyewear with a built-in display screen that will let you snap photos, shoot videos, and surf the Web with the ease of voice commands and finger swipes. In recent months Glass has inspired raves and revulsion about how wearable computing might transform our lives. But there's one person who already has insight, who's been occupying this seemingly faraway galaxy since a long, long time ago.

Considered the father of wearable computing, Mann lives in the upper atmosphere of the geek elite among luminaries such as artificial intelligence pioneer Marvin Minsky and Apple co-founder Steve Wozniak. He's famous not only for inventing the world's first Internet eyeglasses, EyeTap, but for wearing them, pretty much 24/7, for decades. Yes, decades.

Like Google Glass, Mann's innovations are able to surf the Web and record his everyday experiences. But as he shows me during a recent visit in Toronto, that just scratches the surface. By creating a computer-generated display of what he's viewing, he's also able to modify what he sees—say, sharpening his view of something in the distance or overlaying relevant data on an image, like the name of someone he's talking to. His device has also gotten progressively slimmer over time, shrinking down from what looked like a toaster helmet to the sleek eyewear that, for added security, is now attached

to his head. And, yeah, it still looks pretty weird; weird enough that Mann carries around a doctor's note OKing the device just in case anyone—like the guy at McDonald's—gets suspicious.

But on that fateful day in July 2012, the note didn't sufficiently allay the staff's concerns. While Mann and his family were eating, two other employees closed in. Mann, they said, wasn't allowed to take photos or videos in the restaurant without authorization. Mann says when one tried to pull the device from his face, he waved his doctor's note again, explaining that it couldn't be removed from his face without special tools. But the workers tore the note into shreds and shoved the cyborg out the door into the Paris night.

According to Mann, the digital eyeglass got damaged in the scuffle. But as he dusted himself off, Mann realized it wasn't destroyed, and he'd managed to capture photos of the altercation as it was in progress. He soon posted the images online, along with a clinically described account of the fracas, with the hopes of bringing his assaulters to justice. One blogger dubbed the incident "the world's first cybernetic hate crime."



Over lunch at a crowded pub in Toronto, Mann gets more than a few stares. But given the way he goes to town on his burger and salad, shoving clumps of lettuce into his mouth by hand, he really doesn't seem to notice, or to care. When asked if he's bothered by the people ogling his headgear, he ignores the question—as if transmitting, telepathically, "Who gives a shit?"

Mann teaches engineering at the University of Toronto, and after lunch I follow as he briskly strides to his workshop up the street. Though a master of technology, he's awkward with human interactions and tends to split abruptly without notice. The two floors of his studio are cluttered with strange machines and mannequin heads. Mann shows me the various iterations of the EyeTap glasses he's developed over the years. One looks like a helmet worn by the Black Knight in *Monty Python and the Holy Grail*, but with lenses and wires attached. "Even in early

childhood," he tells me, "I took to this idea of attaching things to my body."

Growing up in Hamilton, Ontario, Mann tinkered alongside his grandfather, a refrigeration engineer and welder, building makeshift engines and flyable toy planes. Fascinated by video cameras, which were unwieldy at the time, the intrepid Mann mounted one to a backpack so he could tote it around his neighborhood, filming his surroundings. Before long he had mounted a lens to a helmet and a small computer display, which hung in front of his eyes as he went about his daily life.

"The world looked like a television image," Mann recalls, "except that I could change how it looked by building different electric circuits to manipulate it," adjusting, say, the contrast just as if he were tweaking the settings on his TV. The mission was to enable people, as he puts it, to "see better"—not just the visually impaired, but anyone. By the early 1980s, he was wearing his funky computerized eyewear full-time.

When I first encountered Mann in the late '90s, he'd become one of the more eccentric visionaries in an increasingly eccentric digital age. Even Nicholas Negroponte, cofounder of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology's esteemed Media Lab, where Mann earned his doctorate and refined his wearable computers, called Mann "someone on the lunatic fringe"—but in a good way. Using the nascent Internet, Mann could now transmit pictures from his EyeTap to, for example, get his wife's opinion on which pieces of fruit to buy at the market. Once an outcast for his wares, Mann was on the cusp of some tidal future quickly crashing in. "In the '70s people would see me wearing these things and walk across the street to avoid me," he says. "Now I get kids running over and saying, 'Hey, can I play with that?'"

Today Mann is wearing the fourth-generation version of the EyeTap glasses. Mounted on the aluminum frame is a computer-controlled laser light source, which causes his right eye to function like both a camera and a display. Rays of light bounce off the tiny piece of glass that hangs at a 45-degree angle from

his eye and are processed by a small computer in the headgear, which is powered by batteries or a phone. Light rays are then redrawn on the glass eye in front of his face. He controls it with his phone through voice or text commands. When connected to an iPhone, the device becomes what Mann calls an Eye Phone, giving it the same capabilities of messaging and apps. For example, he can display names of places he's passing in the street or call up a shopping list as he steps into the grocery store.

Whenever I compare his invention to Google Glass, Mann fires a telepathic dart

of frustration. Google's eyewear, which was created decades after Mann's, simply frees up your hands from most of the stuff you normally do on your phone—snapping pictures and video, looking up directions, surfing the Web—by displaying those applications on a small screen that hangs just above your eye. Features are engaged by colloquial voice commands ("OK, Glass...take a photo") or a slight swipe of your fingers along the frame.

Mann's device is less an accessory than a way to see the world. When looking through it, you are seeing a three-dimensional computer-generated version of

reality, created by the quickly drawn laser rays. As a result, the "reality" you see can be augmented and manipulated in a way Google Glass can't provide. "We focus more on functionality than taste," Mann's graduate assistant Raymond Lo tells me. "Google just wants to make it sexy and pretty: it's not of much use at this time."

To show me the techonolgy's capabilities, Lo slips me into a pair of Space-Glasses, a commercial version of the product that will be available in April for \$667 (see "Glass Warfare," opposite). Mann has a stake in the glasses, which are being marketed as a kind of Trekkier alternative to Google Glass. Looking through them, I see a real-time 3D model of the lab around me. It's like having an extremely lifelike video game being drawn instantly in front of my eyes. Virtual objects can be overlaid into the world, so that I can, say, play a game of computer chess or sculpt pixilated clay.

In addition to the everyday, purely functional features—like being able to identify people and places—there are trippy manifestations of the technology. Lo hands me a piece of paper that, with the tap of a few computer buttons, displays a video of the movie *Toy Story*. As I bend the paper, the image bends, too. The possibilities are limited only by imagination. In addition to practical applications, like surrounding

a stranger's face with biographical details drawn from the Internet, Mann tells me, I could simply replace their head with a cartoon character's. Though Mann's work predates, and presages, Google's Glass by at least 20 years, he's not part of their team and hasn't been approached by them. When I ask if Google has violated any of the 100 patents he's filed, he says, matter-of-factly, "They're probably in violation of some," but suggests he doesn't have the money, or the inclination, to pursue them. Anyway, he's more pissed about McDonald's.



The fast-food chain, for its part, denied that its staff attacked Mann. The "interaction with Dr. Mann was polite and did not involve a physical altercation," the company said in a statement. But after he blogged about his alleged assault in France last summer, including photos of the Mickey D's perpetrators, Mann's story went viral and he became an online cause célèbre. Geeks called for a boycott. "That a pioneer like Mann would be accosted—in Paris, of all places—is a travesty," blogged TechCrunch. On KurzweilAI, the blog for noted futurist Ray Kurzweil, Mann was martyred as having suffered the "first attack on a cyborg."

Mann had mixed feelings about the attention. On one hand, he says he doesn't "really find myself having an affinity to the term" *cyborg*. He prefers to see himself as part of a more humanistic pursuit, using computer intelligence not to transform himself into some kind of a machine but rather to enhance his own sense of what it means to be alive. And while Mann hasn't ruled out the possibility of litigation in the future, it's not just the alleged assault that bothers him—it's the hypocrisy he perceives behind it, that McDonald's didn't want someone filming them while they are part of a culture of surveillance that's always watching us.

The word *surveillance*, he points out, is French for watching from above—police, banks, restaurants, for example, eyeing us from their own cameras. He rails against the ubiquity of QR codes, those Internet icons that you photograph in order to call up advertising or promotional information. Establishments tell consumers to use their cameras to shoot the QR codes but then reprimand or punish them for photographing other things. "When we speak of surveillance, we're speaking of a social hierarchy," he says. "They say we're allowed to watch you, but you're not allowed to watch us."

Wearable technology—whether Mann's or Google's—is a means to empower ordinary people to watch back. And it isn't just glasses. In a sense we've been using wearables for years—headsets, earpieces, even, one could argue, those chunky calculator watches. Soldiers don exoskeletons and night-vision goggles. Computers and computerized gear are miniaturizing and augmenting our bodies and clothes more and more every year. For Mann the more we gear up, in essence, the better we can fight back.

"We've already lost our privacy, because surveillance is becoming very widespread," he says. "So maybe we should look at a more balanced world. Would you want to live in a world where there's surveillance only and where there's the one-sided gaze, or would you rather live in a world in which we're all seeing clearly?"

Not everyone agrees. There's already

mounting concern over the erosion of privacy due to Google Glass, which will make it even easier for people to photograph or film each other on the sly. Back in New York I get to experience this firsthand when I try on a pair of Google Glass frames myself. Outfitted with my sleek orange rims, I round the block by Chelsea Market, where I'm fashionably ignored by the unfazed city dwellers. With a whisper and swipe, I take indiscriminate shots of passersby—two construction workers talking football, a harried woman on her way to work. There's nothing incriminating here, but it does feel creepily invasive, way more so than if I were lifting up my iPhone to snap the photos. All things considered, it's not surprising that a number of establishments have banned their use.

Google has countered by noting that the device's screen glows when it's being used for these purposes and that users have to either tap their glasses or issue an audio command—ostensibly alerting those around them—for this to work. Of course, those being observed won't necessarily discern these cues. And Google recently announced a way to take photos with just a wink (setting off concerns over a next-gen wave of up-skirt photos).

But as Mann tries to use the McDonald's saga to engage this conversation, some view this pursuit with skepticism. Thad Starner, director of the Contextual Computing Group at the Georgia Institute of Technology and the technical lead on Google Glass, has been working on wearables for decades as well and considers Mann a provocateur. "I don't know if it's performance art or not," Starner says of the McDonald's incident. "The question is: Did he amp it up to make the point?"

Early last decade, Mann released a documentary showing him getting thrown out by employees of a Walmart after filming the store's security cameras with his EyeTap glasses. He's had similar run-ins with airport security, the Secret Service, and the New York City Police Department.



As bizarre as Mann's practices may seem, there's a genuine playfulness and humor behind his Cylon exterior. When I ask him if he thinks technology will get so discreet—say, implants or contact lenses—that we won't have to wear cyberglasses anymore, he deadpans his response. "I think we'll always be wearing things," he says. "At least in Canada. It's way too cold here."

At heart he's still the kid in his grand-

pa's garage inventing cool machines. Before leaving, I climb the steps behind him to a rooftop greenhouse, where he keeps one of his proudest accomplishments: a musical instrument called the hydraulophone. Among the dewy plants dripping inside, there's what looks like a tubular pipe organ hooked up to a hose. Mann sits behind it on a stationary bike that's attached to the instrument. As he pedals, water shoots out through a series of holes on the pipe. By gently placing his fingers against each stream, he creates a different musical note. He has performed this along with a band he calls the H₂Orchestra.

As Mann plays through an ethereal version of my request, "Stairway to Heaven," he doesn't sweat the water dousing his pants. He just plays the organ like a mad musical scientist, filling the air with his sounds. For him this kind of moment is what his work is really about: not turning people into machines but creating machines that make people, in a sense, more human, whether they're playing water music or perceiving the world through a lens. "I think as an inventor, if I can make people's lives better and allow people to connect to nature," he tells me when he's done, "that means a lot." 🍷



GLASS WARFARE

With SpaceGlasses, due out this spring, Mann and his team are aiming to take the fight for the future of wearable computing straight to Google. Here's what they offer.



For three decades Steve Mann has been developing his EyeTap technology, and now the rest of us get to reap the fruits of his work. The Meta SpaceGlasses are a commercial version of Mann's smart eyewear, available this spring for \$667. So what does that get you? And why choose SpaceGlasses over Google Glass?

"SpaceGlasses provide a true 3D



vision and user interface," says Mann, and don't cause the eye-strain that results from having only one eye engaged, as with Google Glass. Users will be able to interact directly with the 3D world, whether playing chess (1), or video games,

like this first-person shooter (2), or "sculpting" objects with hand gestures (3), and sending the objects to a 3D printer. You'll also be able to use them for more functional applications. For instance, they'll help you build something

out of Legos (4). Conceivably, Mann says, "One can even use SpaceGlasses to make more SpaceGlasses."

In other words, while Mann and his team see Google Glass as merely a variation on the smartphone—albeit one you can use hands-free—SpaceGlasses are an all-new technology that users can employ in real-world scenarios. The future is now!

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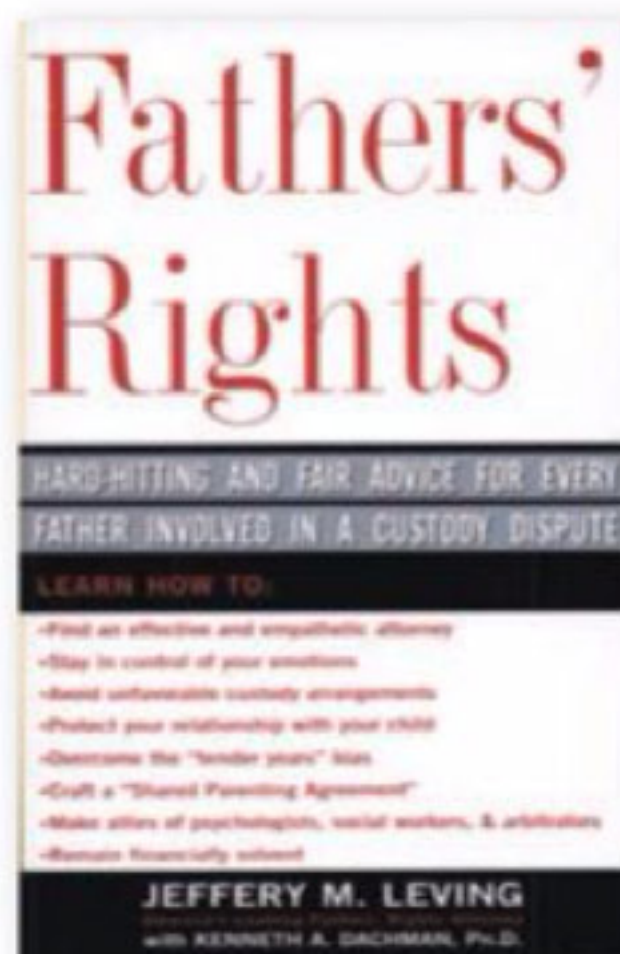
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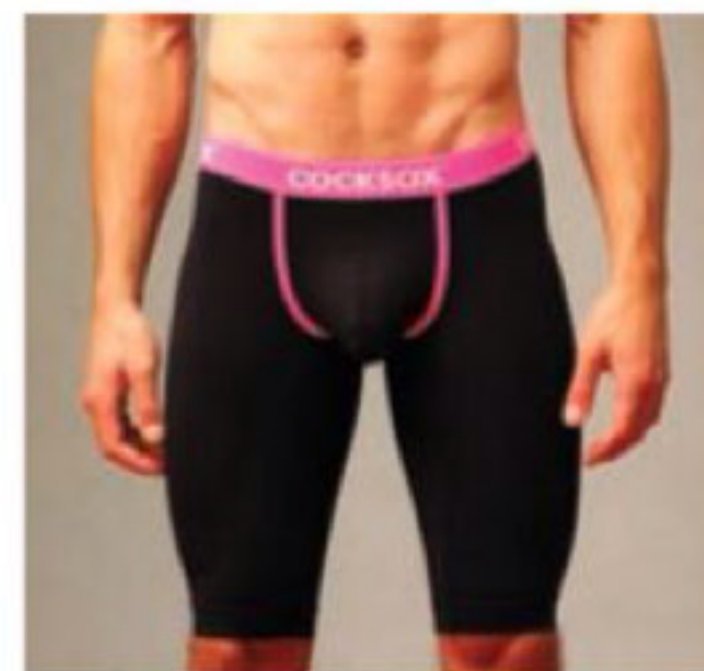
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Shakira

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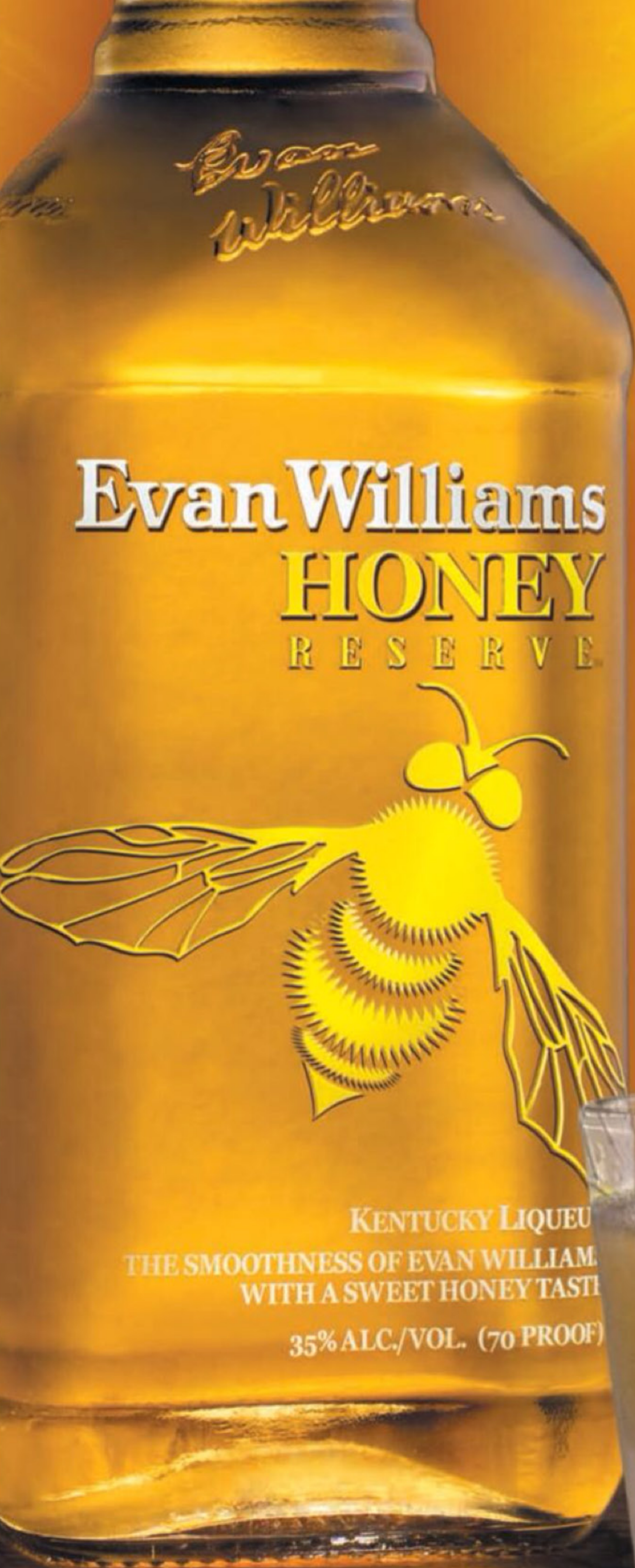
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
