I KEVIN! SO, YOU'VE GOT THIS DVD, TEABAGGING IN IRELAND...? If you've always thought the idea of watching two middle-aged men speak to one another is boring, this will absolutely change your mind. This is riveting conversation about a guy who almost died from drugs talking himself back into the land of the living. It's funny as fuck and you've never heard sex stories like this before. YOU'VE SOMEHOW BUILT A PODCAST-BASED EMPIRE THROUGH YOUR SMODCAST

NETWORK. WAS THAT A PLAN? No, I'm just fucking spinning plates like crazy. My friend Scott was asking recently, like

"Was there a moment?" like a bi-curious teen saying "When did you know you were gay?" to somebody who figured it out and was eating dick already. But there was no formula. It just sort of happened.

WAS IT SOMETHING TO DO WITH SHITTY EXPERIENCES IN HOLLYWOOD?

When I made Zack And Miri, even though I like that movie, it wasn't what I got in this business to do. I was doing an imitation of me, or an imitation of someone else who was influenced by me, Judd Apatow. The kid who made Clerks would have made fun of the guy struggling to figure out what to do next. It felt like in order to stay in the game, I was subverting why I got into the game in the first place. I decided I didn't want to do it any more. THAT'S A PRETTY BIG DECISION TO MAKE. I thought instead of serving one master I'd serve a bunch. You make these films, and people who don't make films tell you you're doing it wrong. It was tough to put it to the side, because film money is like heroin, man. HEROIN? YEAH, WE'VE HEARD THAT'S **KINDA MOREISH....**

I mean, I've never had heroin, but I've got a buddy who's been knee fuckin' deep in heroin many times, and I've seen the effect that has on people. The draw it has, how you can be standing in front of a dude crying, saying "Please stop stealing from me and taking drugs. You're killing this friendship and yourself," and he'll cry right back at you and say he'll stop then do some more heroin. It's a very addictive chunk of money to be involved with. If you're gonna walk away, you've got to realise you're not going to be able to get hold of that kinda money again, which is obviously a concern because I have a family to feed and I've got accustomed to a certain lifestyle. That's the fucking trip.

RIGHT, SO YOU BECAME A DIRECTOR-FOR-HIRE...

Yeah, I'd been directing long enough that without trying, I'd got better at telling visual stories. I did it for over ten years, I knew how to do that shit. So I did Cop Out. Notwithstanding the fucking Bruce Willis of it all, it was a great experience. The studio were great, they changed my perception of the whores-whowant-your-money thing. Everyone wanted to make a good movie – the studios are a commercial business, but they don't want to put a bad film out. They're not all Satanic fucking warriors looking to service Lucifer by sacrificing art. But afterwards I knew I had to do my own weird shit. It's not why I got into it. I saw Slacker and went "I want to be a filmmaker," not "I want to adapt other people's scripts."

BUT THE MONEY, KEVIN, THE MONEY...?

There's always ways to make money. I can rely on my mouth to make money – I could literally suck dicks if I ,had to, or I could just talk.

HENCE THE PODCASTS?

I always loved the comedian George Carlin, and I love how candid Howard Stern is. Most people try and spin and sell and gloss, but here's a guy being honest, just walking up and talking. **RIGHT, LIKE THE LACK OF BARRIERS?**

The movie business takes so fuckin' long. Podcasting, I just put it out there. I can express myself without having to get \$20,000,000 and Ben Affleck. That makes me feel good and young. Look at me five years ago and I look much younger now – although that has a lot to do with weed, I smoke a lot of weed. **DO YOU FEEL LIKE YOU HAVE FINISHED YOUR STORY AS A**

FILMMAKER THEN? When people get together and make art, it's passion that brings them there.

Sure, some cats are like "Let's make money," but it's a desire to emote, something they're arrogant enough to want to share with people, that's what gets them there. I did that with Clerks, and had enough experience left in me for a few more films that were honest and no-bullshit, but at a certain point, if all you're doing is making films or albums professionally, you're not living life anymore. Jay And Silent Bob Strike Back is funny, but it's a movie made by a guy who'd done nothing but make movies for ten years. Chasing Amy is about struggling with male sexual anxiety, but Strike Back is about a guy struggling with nothing, like "Life's awesome, bitch, let's make a fucking best-of movie!"

DID YOU INVENT THE IDEA OF MOVIE BROMANCES WITH JAY AND SILENT BOB?

I didn't call it that, it was called that

later on. Two dudes that weren't fucking but were in love, hetero lifemates. But other people do it more lucratively – Judd Apatow found out how to make a bromance that connects with a mainstream audience way better than I can. So my work here is done – I'm not the guy who does it best, just the guy who did it first. **AND YOU'VE MADE YOUR BUDDIES INTO TV STARS NOW, WITH COMIC**

INTO TV STARS NOW, WITH COMIC BOOK MEN...

People reacted well to them on the podcasts, and I was like "These are the friends who made me who I am today." Brian Johnson was fighting some inner demons, but suddenly people are saying he's funny and he gets the kinda validation he doesn't get often. We pushed them and pushed them and now they're on a TV show. I had to talk them into it but it was something that organically happened from sitting down and chatting with friends.

SO WHAT'S YOUR JOB NOW?

I get the opportunity to do lots of different shit. Most people are like, "I'll become the best director in the world!" but I never even thought about being a director, I just wanted to write and one day said "Fuck it, I'll direct it." In the indie movie scene people were making movies and didn't have any experience so it seemed like anyone could. People were like "Don't you want to win an Oscar?" Fuck no, man! I wouldn't be like, shove it up your ass, not if someone offered me it, but campaign for it? No man I'm not aiming for that, that isn't my ultimate goal, for a fucking statue? No man, on my deathbed I'll be dying screaming but content, I did everything I wanted to do, not just that one thing I was expected to do. I did films and it was fun, but you know what's more fun? Sitting with my friends talking shit into a microphone. FRONT

WHERE DO YOU DRAW **INSPIRATION FROM?**

A couple of weeks ago my friend showed me this Japanese game for the original Nintendo called Pizza Pop where you deliver pizzas and jump on cats. In my opinion, that is fucking genius. Pizza Pop is probably the most recent thing. I like other stuff too, like old Bullmark kaiju toys and bad VHS horror movies. WHAT DO YOU DO WHEN YOU'RE **NOT DRAWING?**

I spend a lot of time with my daughter. She's seven. We've been working on a game together with this program called Scratch. It's

> pretty cool. She likes to draw too, and make up stories. I'll write things out and she'll draw the pictures. I used to play music, I've been getting back into that more as well.

WHAT WOULD BE THE END **OF THE RAINBOW FOR** YOU? Dying.

TELL US A QUICK BIT ABOUT YOURSELF AND YOUR WORK.

I live in Edinburgh, Indiana - the veneer capital of the world, or at least used to be. My work is like a dream about a cheap all-you-can-eat buffet. WHAT ARE YOU WORKING

ON TODAY?

Some sculptures for a vinyl toy release with Rampage Toys. Paintings for a show at Grasshut. A drawing for a sweatshirt I'm doing with Whistle, and a comic I'm doing with Space Face Books.

TALK US THROUGH A TYPICAL JOB. FROM THE INITIAL IDEA TO A COMPLETED PIECE.

Once I get the brief I get something to eat, or hang out with some friends. Something besides drawing. I've found it works better for me to let things formulate in my head a while rather than immediately start. Once I get some ideas I turn those into sketches, get some feedback on the direction to go in, and try to come up with a solid pencil drawing. That's the most important part. Once the composition is there and I get it in the computer it becomes a little more straightforward.

WHAT'S BEEN YOUR FAVOURITE **PROJECT TO DATE?**

Probably the Hawaii Werewolf toy I did last year. My skills as a sculptor are definitely better now, but it was one of the first toys I did that had that balance of trashiness and stupidity. **IS THERE A STORY BEHIND THE** HAWAII WEREWOLF SERIES?

There is a loose backstory with Hawaii Werewolf being a regular werewolf that got bitten by a human. I may slowly tell that story in comic book form at some point. The series is influenced by Magnum PI and bad 80s toys. If you took some LSD and had some weird trip about how you were a private investigator and had some case that led you to the toy section in a bad department store, you would find these toys there. IS THE PROCESS OF MAKING YOUR **OWN TOY A DIFFICULT ONE? WAS CREATING TOYS SOMETHING YOU**

ALWAYS WANTED TO DO?

It isn't that difficult, but it can be time-consuming. I sculpt my toys with Sculpey Firm, make a silicone mould, then pour resin to make copies. That's the basic process. Creating toys is something I always wanted to do. but it wasn't until I found out about resin that I started sculpting. I didn't want to learn to sculpt just to spend a bunch of

He's one of the world's most innovative skaters, exploring skateboarding's expanding horizons. Richie Jackson tells us why you should always keep searching...

"My purpose is to explore skateboarding's psychedelic



They can take a long time, and it's a really full-on 100% dedication kind of deal. I'd been working on the video since the beginning of October and it hit the site in December. Dudes definitely go all-out to go there every day and get it done.

WHAT WAS THE HARDEST TRICK TO FILM FOR IT?

Probably the backside nose Natas spin (named after skater Natas Kaupas). Going frontside I'd done before, so I was able to do that relatively quickly, but I had to have about five different sessions at the backside til it actually stuck. It looks easy but it was definitely the toughest.

HOW DID YOU COME TO BE SKATING FOR DEATH?

I was skating at Manly Bowl in Sydney after school one day and Nick Orrechio, the owner of Death Skateboards just happened to be there on a little Aussie trip and was looking to expand his British company across the globe. He just saw me skating and I wasn't even skating well, but he just decided "Hey, I'll take a chance, have some stickers, maybe I'll send you some boards," and that was enough psychological fuel for me that it pushed me to pursue it. That was my first sponsor, had he not been there and given me that opportunity I wouldn't have believed it about

myself and I probably wouldn't have pursued it as seriously as I have. WHEN DID YOU TAKE THE LEAP TO GO AND MOVE TO LA?

I moved here about two years ago but I'd been coming back and forth for years. I looked at my passport one year and noticed that I'd been in the United States more than home. I feel more at home here for sure. **HOW DO YOU HYPE YOURSELF**

BEFORE GOING OUT SKATING? I don't know! I just go out and just hope that things start moving in a good direction.

DO YOU NOT LISTEN TO ANY MUSIC OR ANYTHING BEFORE HAND?

I did whilst I was at the Berrics, they have a boombox there so I would put on a couple things. I mostly listen to music that I'm planning to skate to. I would start playing stuff that thought I might be good to skate to and Chase (The Berrics filmer) would listen to it with me and I'd wait for him to ask who it is, and I would say I liked it, and that's how we ended up with the Orange Wedge song. I like to suggest a song but I also want the filmer and editor to be completely sold on it.

IN YOUR JOINT PART FOR THE DEATH VIDEO, ORDINARY MADNESS, YOU SYNCED THE MUSIC TO YOUR SKATING, THAT MUST HAVE TAKEN FOREVER?!

Man it was hard! The hardest thing about it was letting go of our trick standards that Patrick Melcher and I hold so dearly. We couldn't do any mind-blowing tricks, we had to do tricks we could pull off every shot while still trying to make them as good as possible. But then the concept took over and was just like "OK, maybe this isn't just about



the tricks, maybe this is just about demonstrating a different approach to the whole skate video process." WAS IT ALWAYS PLANNED THAT YOU WOULD HAVE A JOINT SECTION?

Yeah, Patrick always wanted to do it. He was always really behind the idea but I didn't want to do just a standard joint section. It was when I heard that song by Johnny Cash and Joe Strummer and figured it out that we could do a duet that that whole thing got rolling.

WHAT INSPIRES YOU TO GO OUT AND SKATE EVERY DAY CREATING THE TRICKS YOU DO?

It works because of a deep human question that everybody has which is simply 'What is possible?'. When we go out every day and skate we quickly find that our particular body of skateboarding knowledge is entirely amorphous and has no defined back-story. That question seems to lead us to infinite progressions every day and we haven't run into a boundary that's gonna cap it off. There's obviously the raw physics of it and then the limitations of willpower - but neither of those seem to be stopping us! The possibilities continue to roll on and it's an exciting thing to be a part of when you realise you're dealing with an infinite entity here. IN COMPARISION TO OTHER PRO SKATERS YOU KNOW, HOW EASY IS **IT FOR YOU TO GET TRICKS?**

It's hard for me, I work for it. I take a long time to put things together. There's a lot of love and dedication going into everything I create. I can't just go out and whip something together. It's very time-consuming and I go back multiple times to get everything the way I want it. YOUR INSTAGRAM BIO READS **"EXPLORING SKATEBOARDING'S PSYCHEDELIC FRONTIER". WILL** YOU EVER CONQUER IT ALL?

By definition it's un-conquerable, that's why I love it. Exploring is the greatest thing I can do. I know there's no finish line that can never be arrived at, and I know that the universe as I see it is one without purpose. I've really come to see things in a pretty terrifying fashion! The fact that nothing has any purpose of existing can be quite frightening until you realise that the humans self-appoint purposes to things - and I self appoint my purpose as exploring skateboarding's psychedelic frontier!

WHAT'S HAPPENED RECENTLY

THAT HAS MADE YOU GO **"THIS IS WHY I EXPLORE** THIS INSANE THING THAT IS SKATEBOARDING!"?

That would be meeting William Spencer, the skateboard ninja, and seeing the way his brain is processing the world. It changed my perception to start thinking about the histamines and superorganisms like an ant colony. He has one of the fastest moving perceptions in skating that I've seen - everything that he sees is almost like a potential equation to him. I used to approach it by thinking of a trick that I wanted to do and then looked for the right spot to do it. William does the opposite of that, he goes to a spot that seemingly has nothing, and he stares at it for long enough that something will pop out. I feel that's such a better approach.

SO YOU WOULD ALWAYS JUDGE A **SKATE SPOT STRAIGHT AWAY?**

I did do it like that but I would move on and look for something else. The difference is: are you looking for something that you want to be there or are you looking at what is really there? And then developing an idea from that. I mean, every single street corner is unique and it's such a strange landscape where every instance differs from the next and



rather than fight that it's a way of taking advantage. WHO'S YOUR FAVOURITE SKATER

TO SKATE WITH?

Probably William and Patrick Melcher – I like skaters that are freaks and I like skaters that are cerebral and that are thinking about what they're doing rather than just not think about it and go for it, I like the dudes that are calculated and bizarre.

THE ONE THING PEOPLE SEE STRAIGHT AWAY WHEN THEY SEE YOU IS HOW YOU DRESS, DO PEOPLE **GET THROWN OFF BY IT?**

They do, which is strange to me because I see clothes as nothing more than a bit of fun. What is it apart from some fun? People might perceive it as gimmicky and I'll say straight-up that it is - clothes are a gimmick. They are nothing more. Let me make it very plain that I am not a hippy or a '60s revivalist by any means. I really dislike the notion that the greatest times have already come and gone and that we're living in some kind of lame future where all the possibilities have been exhausted. I'm the opposite, but I'm by no means a retro act. I believe that the greatest possibilities are yet to be actualised and we're actively pursuing them everyday. FRONT

VANS

WHAT IS IT ABOUT VANS THAT YOU LIKE SO MUCH?

I've always had an affinity for wild, colourful clothing (such as my collection of Hawaiian shirts) and obviously Vans has no shortage of wild, colourful designs. I like slip-ons, and they're fun and casual.

WHEN DID YOU START COLLECTING THEM? WHAT WAS YOUR FIRST PAIR OF VANS?

I don't remember, really – I assume I got my first pair in the early to mid-80s. I've seen the promo shots taken around the time of my second album ("Weird Al" Yankovic In 3D, released in 1984) and I was definitely wearing Vans then.

HOW MANY PAIRS HAVE YOU GOT? I haven't ever counted, but there's a wall full of them. Easily several dozen.

DO YOU HAVE A FAVOURITE PAIR? Not really – I generally

put on whichever pair happens to be closest and isn't

completely worn out yet.

HAVE YOU WORN THEM ALL OR ARE THERE ANY PAIRS THAT YOU'VE NEVER WORN?

I believe I have a couple special pairs in a box somewhere, waiting for that special formal occasion when I absolutely need to wear mintcondition Vans.

DO YOU HAVE ANY PARTICULARLY RARE PAIRS?

I think so – Steve Van Doren came over to my house once and looked at my collection, and he was impressed by some of the Vans from the 80s that I still had. I think he said that the MTV-branded ones were quite rare and collectible.

WHAT MADE YOU START ACCUMULATING ALL THIS STUFF?

I come from a family of collectors. When I was younger my older brother took me to thrift stores and garage sales, he had an eclectic taste and my collecting style has mimicked his. Being a kid in the 80s, I collected He-Man, G.I Joe, Transformers and Madballs and when I went to flea markets my brother would buy me toys from his childhood, from the 50s and 60s. This really got me into vintage stuff. **HOW MANY PIECES DO YOU HAVE IN YOUR ENTIRE COLLECTION?**

I think I bridge the gap between a hoarder and a collector. It's got to be thousands of pieces. Recently I've been trying to downsize because I've moved to a smaller apartment, so I only have the best of the best on display. I have a large collection of Mr. T memorabilia, but I don't really live with that – it's mostly in boxes.

WHAT'S YOUR RAREST ITEM?

I have a prototype for the 8" Mr. T figure that was made for Galoob. Other than Mr. T, the Nagnagnags are pretty rare – some are one-of-a-kind, test figures and stuff. They're essentially the same mould and figure but then Shigeru paints them by hand – he's one of the most amazing painters I've ever seen. Plus the paint that's used is banned in the US because it's toxic! **HOW MUCH SPARE TIME DO YOU DEDICATE TO THIS?**

A lot! I'm on eBay daily. Nowadays I don't have a lot of time to go to places to shop, plus New York is not the easiest place to find stuff and when you do it's a bit higher priced. **IS THERE A HOLY GRAIL?**

I've always wanted a real mummy's hand, and recently I bought one! It was really expensive, but sort of fell into my lap. I ended up paying for it in installments! It's a whole new level of collectibles – it's an ancient artifact, not a Mr. T doll.

HOW MANY VHS TAPES HAVE YOU GOT?

Last time I checked it was just over 2000 tapes. I used to keep a running tally but I kept getting so many delivered that I gave up counting. It was over 4000 before I got rid of my non-rental tapes but I cut that down regretfully. **WHAT ATTRACTED YOU TO START COLLECTING THIS**

STUFF? It basically stems from not wanting to replace an entire media by jumping to another format. I don't think any other format will last as long as VHS did because there'll always be something new

in five to ten years. Just look



at DVD – nobody buys them anymore, it's all Blu-Ray now, soon they'll all be obsolete, it'll all be streaming media. People are losing touch with the physical formats and the act of actually owning something. WHEN DID YOU START COLLECTING? I was about 13 when I started collecting tapes purely to watch, for example I bought every John Candy film just because I was a fan. Then at 15 I started my first job, so every payday I'd go to market stalls and car boot sales to pick up tapes. When I was younger it was any film that I wanted to see, but now that I'm older I only collect ex-rental tapes. Firstly because they were built to last and secondly they're the original video store releases which is much more appealing to me. DO YOU THINK YOU'LL EVER

SELL YOUR COLLECTION? Never in a million years!

WHAT FIRST ATTRACTED YOU TO QUEEN STUFF?

When I was six or seven my Mum used to buy the 7" records. Then at school, my friend Mark (drummer for LostAlone) and I started going to record fairs and spending our £2 pocket money on records. Initially it was just the music I was interested in and then it fed

into "Well I've got it on 12", now I need the 7", now I need the box-sets with the extras." **WHAT WAS THE FIRST ONE**

SUPREME

WHY DID YOU START COLLECTING?

I don't actually see myself as a collector, I just happen to like a lot of stuff! Supreme was the first skate store I stumbled across during my first visit to NYC in 1994 so it was just through skating. The store had only just opened so there was no hype or collecting involved, it was just a cool little store. The shelves were full of box tees at 20 bucks each back then! Since then I've visited NYC several times per year, and a lot of that OG crew became friends I still hang with. WHAT'S THE RAREST ITEM IN **YOUR COLLECTION?**

Probably some of the box logo tees from the early to mid 90s, the first couple of Nike SB collabs and the 10th Anniversary Kate Moss shirt. **WHAT'S YOUR FAVOURITE PIECE?** The simple red on white box logo tee – it's a timeless classic. I have one of the special versions they make just for Jason Dill - it's really thin and slim fitting rather than the classic shape. That's probably my favourite just because it's a great fit.

SO, VELVET PAINTINGS

I've always liked them. I had a friend when I was eight whose dad taught me karate, but when he wasn't teaching karate he did velvet paintings, mainly of nude women. That's where my fascination began – the nude women helped, but it was the colour too, the way it popped off the black.

WE DON'T HAVE THEM OVER HERE. WHAT ARE THEY?

They're painted in a completely different way. They're a common thing to find being sold to gringos in Mexican border towns. The most common one you'll see is a velvet Elvis, although they do a load of other pop culture icons like Willie Nelson and Clint Eastwood. I've had a couple of them commissioned by a company called Indignico, like The Dude from The Big Lebowski. The company's a lifeline for all these old broke Mexican artists. HAVE YOU EVER TRIED PAINTING ONE YOURSELF?

I'm a bit apprehensive about trying, because then the sky's the limit. I'd end up with thousands. As it stands, I've got



about 40. I had a few commissioned but most have been bought by my wife and I. The JonBenét Ramsey one is one of my favourites, it's creepy.

HAVE YOU EVER HAD AN AMAZING ONE SLIP THROUGH YOUR FINGERS? I lost a bidding war on a naked Dolly Parton velvet painting. It was really well painted. I don't own any nudes, but if you're going to, that's the one to have. Sometimes you get some really shitty ones because they're rushed, but some are done by extremely talented artists. It's weird because it's not highly regarded as fine art, but if you were to transfer the painting to a canvas people would love it. The value goes down if it's on velvet.

HOW DID YOU START COLLECTING TOYS?

Every week my mom would take me to Gold Circle where they had racks of Star Wars figures and I remember thinking 'I want all of these toys, every single last one!' A lot of them I sold in garage sales, which was sad. I would post on Myspace and ask fans if they could bring toys to our shows in exchange for tickets, t-shirts, an autograph on their tits or whatever. I remember getting a Millennium



Falcon off a kid then walking past the queue waiting to see Mastodon with my arms full of toys and all the fans were like "What the fuck?" A lot of stuff is in my attic but I do have a Star Wars room. I even named my first child Harrison, after Han Solo!

FOUR-EYED PUNK ROCK LEGENDS DESCENDENTS HAVE BEEN GOING FOR 35 YEARS. MUSIC WOULDN'T BE THE SAME WITHOUT THEM, BUT WHAT WAS IT THAT MADE THEM SO ACE?

THEY FORMED THROUGH NERDINESS

"I met [guitarist] Frank Navetta through fishing, and just being two of the people who didn't fit in in high school," says drummer Bill Stevenson. "The people that don't fit in have a way of finding each other." After recruiting bassist Tony Lombardo from hearing his bass half a block away, they ended up with vocalist Milo Aukerman through geography as much as anything else. "Milo and I had this PE teacher who was cruel to Milo, the typical thing of a jock picking on a nerd. And it endeared me to Milo because I sympathised with his position: here's this idiot picking on the smartest guy in class. Soon, Milo became a fixture at our practices. Frank didn't want to sing and play guitar at the same time, and one day Frank said 'Fuck it, we should make Milo sing."

2THEY WERE OFF THEIR TITS ON COFFEE

Hard to believe but the Descendents initially played surf pop-punk before becoming addicted to strong-ass coffee. The songs, like their attention spans, got much shorter. "We started drinking too much coffee," Milo later admitted. "Because of that and me joining, the music became very quick and about bursts of energy." Like the man says in 'Coffee Mug':

"I don't need no booze or drugs, I just chug-a-lugon my coffee mug."

THEY WEREN'T ASHAMED OF THEIR DORKINESS

Cementing their place as punk legends is their 1982 album Milo Goes To College, featuring a caricature of their front-nerd on the cover, in an iconic image that looks like Fido Dido fucked a

Simpson. The album's now become legendary, but it dropped like a wet turd. Still, The Los Angeles Times said it was, "perfect for the little guy who was ever called a nerd and never got the girl."

4 ARABIDOPSIS IS SO FUCKING PUNK ROCK

Holding a doctorate in biochemistry might sound impressive today but in the early 80s everyone thought you were a wanker if you liked science and punk rock. Yet Milo really did get a hard-on for cells and plants. He's still a biochemist today and identifies genes in the plant Arabidopsis that might be used to improve maize. He could never decide whether to dedicate himself to punk or science and has carefully spent his entire adult life doing both, choosing what he fancies year to year. However, thank fuck he doesn't mix the two. "I will probably never ever write a song about DNA," he says.

PUNK=SCIENCE "Biology in particular values those who question conventional wisdom, trying to debunk what's accepted," says Aukerman. "We're always looking for discoveries that challenge current thinking. Punk rock is like that, too." Or as Bill Cuevas, biochemist at the biotech company Genencor and music director at the Stanford University radio station KZSU says, "Punk ethos is typified by a passionate adherence to individualism, creativity and freedom of expression with no regard to established opinions. Good scientific discipline is also typified by such qualities, including inquisitiveness and curiosity, with no entrenchment to established beliefs." Yeah!

GTHEY LIKED BEING DIFFERENT

Singing songs about coffee and being a science nerd was hard work in the early 80s punk days of slamming and spitting, and the band had to earn their stripes. "When we would play a show with The Germs or some of those bands, often their fans didn't take us seriously, or would try to beat us up while onstage," Bill Stevenson says. "That being said, we were never trying to pander to the scene. I mean, that's the most un-punk thing I can think of. We were just doing our thing."

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FEATURE DESCENDENTS

THEY SORT OF SEMI-INVENTED BLACK FLAG

While Milo went to college, Bill Stevenson joined Panic, who later became Black Flag. Stevenson was present for several important Flag albums, including Slip It In and Loose Nut. "We all grew up in the same small neighbourhood," Bill says of Black Flag. "I could throw a rock to Greg Ginn's parents' house from my house. We always shared practice rooms. We were kind of like brother bands, I guess. The Descendents was more of a hobby. It wasn't until I left Black Flag that Descendents did their first proper tour." These days Stevenson is a producer, having worked with such bands as NOFX and Rise Against.

8 RESPONSIBLE FOR ANOTHER KILLER BAND

Instead of keeping Descendents going while Milo was looking at plants, Bill Stevenson plus Descendents bassist Karl Alvarez and guitarist Stephen Egerton formed All. There's a bit of a blurred line between Descendents and All, with one band's demos often ending up being recorded by the other. For a while both bands were on the same label, which sort of doesn't make sense really.

SUFFIXAGE

You'll notice that many Descendents songs end with –age, even when they're not real words. Carneage, Tonyage, Myage and Bikeage all stem from an irritating high school habit of Bill's. "There are a certain amount of words, like sewage, marriage, that end with an '-age'

and, somewhere along the line, it was a joke in school that Billy would walk around and add '-age' to everything, like 'Look at that guitarage''' says Milo. "'Myage' was called that because it's his song, it's my song, so it's 'Myage'. We didn't really go into titles, we'd just name them whatever." Later a documentary, Filmage, would immortalise this trait.

10 THEY RECORDED I DON'T WANT TO GROW UP

In 1985 The Descendents released a record with a geeky baby on the cover, posing like a primordial dwarf Buddha, naked except for a nappy. Just under 30 minutes of punk rock heaven, it saw the band improving and refining their sound and making their songs more memorable. Bands like Weezer probably wouldn't exist without this album, and the cover art is etched into Travis Barker's leg.

THEY LEARNED FROM THEIR UNSEXY NO-SEX MISTAKES

"I wanted her cherry, I got sour grapes," sings Milo in Sour Grapes, one of many tributes to the female form. Oddly for a biochemist, he didn't get laid very often. "I didn't know how to talk to girls," he says, "and I was convinced they thought they were too good for me. What then developed was a pretty typical case of teenage misogyny – you're not gonna fuck me, so fuck off! In retrospect, if I hadn't been so clueless about girls, I might have gotten laid a few times and then I wouldn't have been so pissed off."

12THEY LIKE FARTS

Enjoy, the opening track of the album of the same name, is a celebration of farting, although when writing the lyrics, Milo accidentally told the world he had a vagina. "I used the word 'queef' in it without knowing what it meant," he says.

13 PRACTICE SAFE-SEX SKATEBOARDING

It was the idea of director Dave Robinson to dress the band and their fans in condoms for the video for I'm The One. "When I got on that skateboard in that costume, I don't know, things just started to work," Milo says. "Don't forget, we spend a lot of our time being incredibly stupid, not to mention juvenile. Having lived through the 80s I'm turned off by production values because I think, 'Well, are we doing a Peter Gabriel album? Shouldn't the video be crappy to fit the music?"

4 THEY'VE GONE IN EVERY POSSIBLE DIRECTION

The original lineup have managed to try pretty much everything you can do after being in a band. Bill Stevenson beat a grapefruit-sized tumour and is an engineer and producer. Milo Aukerman is a scientist. Tony Lombardo works in a post office. Frank Navetta quit the music industry, burned all his equipment and

died. Try finding a band with more varied stories than that, motherfucker. "Most bands, once somebody leaves, there's this quarreling and fighting," says Bill. "We've never had that. Everybody that's ever been in the band is friends with everybody that's ever been in the band."

> played a shit-ton of bad tours and had a lot of challenges, but now everything feels like it's in the right place. I've got a feeling it's going to be a good year. WHAT IS AN AVERAGE TONIGHT ALIVE SHOW LIKE?

I've become a dancer and I don't know where it started. We were more of a mosh band, getting the crowd to split in two and starting circle pits and stuff like that, but there's a lot more dancing going on on stage at the minute. **YOU'RE ALWAYS ON TOUR, HOW DO YOU KEEP SANE?**

I've read interviews with bands who say they're losing their fucking minds and that they fight all the time, but we've been friends for years so even when we're home we hang out together. It's like having your family with you all the time but in a really good way!

WHAT ARE YOUR TOUR BUS ESSENTIALS?

I guess my iPod, because you can either choose to share music or keep it to yourself. If you want some time alone you can listen to music, if you want to hang out you can listen to music. ON THIS TOUR YOU'RE PLAYING BRIXTON ACADEMY. HOW DOES THAT FEEL?

It's weird because I've never seen it so I don't understand how much of a big deal everyone says it is. I've spoken to a lot of people who've said that's where they've seen their favourite bands play, and I'm dying to get to that level. **YOU'RE ALSO HEADING OUT ON WARPED TOUR...**

I'm so excited! Every day is different. It's the same routine with touring but it's always with different people. People say



with Warped that you get what you give, and I know bands who've come away hating it. I think if you're ready to put your mind and body into it you can't not feel good about it.

THERE'S A LOT OF AUSSIE BANDS BREAKING EUROPE AT THE MINUTE, IS THERE SOMETHING IN THE WATER?

I think it's because it's fucking hard to make something of yourself in Australia. We don't have the same sort of support as places like the UK with magazines like FRONT, or Radio 1 that can play Taylor Swift and Bring Me The Horizon back-toback. So if you want to survive you've got to try really hard. But if you hit it right, the timing is right and the music is right then it goes a long way when you break out of the country, which I think is the case for Amity Affliction, Parkway Drive and stuff. THEY'RE MUCH HEAVIER

THAN YOU GUYS, IS THERE MUCH OF A POP-PUNK SCENE IN AUSTRALIA?

When we started the only bands we were supporting were hardcore and metal because that's what was thriving at the time. We were one of the only bands playing around with the pop genre. People didn't know whether to take us seriously and it didn't make sense to them. But the genre started taking off internationally and now the Australia scene is really growing. DO YOU LISTEN TO METAL AS WELL AS POP-PUNK?

Today I was listening to Slipknot and Terror, but I followed that up with Alanis Morrisette and No Doubt. I listen to whatever mood I'm in. Metal gets me psyched for a bit but then it all gets too heavy. **YOU'RE ALSO A LOVER OF TUMBLR. DON'T YOU EVER GET BORED OF PICTURES OF CATS?** It cracks me up. I'm sure some

people think it's cute but I just piss myself. It's sort of my wind down at the end of the day, laughing at all this stupid shit. DID YOU KNOW THERE'S A FUCKYEAHJENNAMCDOUGALL TUMBLR?

It's nice that people go to that effort. I think it's run by a fan and not a stalker. I guess it helps get our name out there so there's a level of appreciation. **YOU'RE A MASSIVE FALL OUT**

BOY FAN, HOW EXCITED ARE YOU ABOUT THEIR REFORMATION?

I'm very excited! Over time their music's changed but the heart is still there. I love them because of their first two records that I got when I was 13. I saw them at the Acer Arena in Australia and I was in the pit and it was one of the best nights of my life. The Acer Arena is where I want to be, when we've played there I don't want anything else out of life. **FRONT**
