

















LASER PESTS!

Italian designers add some Latin pizzazz to German engineering. Result: bellissimo!

- Bentley has the Continental GT, while Maserati makes the GranTurismo. These are twodoor land yachts with legroom for four grown-ups. BWW used to be part of that pack in the '90s with the 8 Series coupé. That was a long time ago. But now the Germans have talked to some Italians...
- Preaming up with Italian styling house Pininfarina, BMW has created the Gran Lusso Coupé. Ignore the fact it's a "one-off concept car", because BMW has a habit of building almost every concept it spawns and the Lusso will be no exception.
- Featuring BMW trademarks like the shark-nosed grille and long, concave creased





bonnet, the Gran Lusso is a design exercise that's entirely achievable in a production car.

- From behind, the Gran Lusso is dominated by a strip of lights that "lends the BMW L-shape a slender, almost filigree interpretation."
- This Gran Lusso has a V12 motor stuffed under the

bonnet. Measuring 5,972cc, the Bavarian powerhouse is good for 544bhp and delivers maximum torque from only 1,500rpm. It will use the eight-speed paddleplay auto gearbox as used by various existing Beemers, Range Rovers and Jags. So expect to hit 62mph in 4.5 seconds, to

the usual, boring 155mph restricted top end.

And with England tipped to give the Aussies a tonking over the next couple of months, Matthew Hoggard, part of the legendary side that won the trophy back for England in 2005, tells *Nuts* how Australia's 18-year dominance in the contest was finally ended. And as he recalls, this was more like a war than a sporting contest. Take it away, Matt!





1ST TEST, LORD'S 21-24 July. Australia win by 239 runs

"We had a dream first day. Steve Harmison hit Ricky Ponting in the head with a ball and drew blood from his cheek, and no English player went up to see how he was. I'm not saying that was right and I'm not condoning that sort of behaviour, but Justin Langer took umbrage and asked us if we were 'at f**king war' with them. We turned around and said, 'Yes!' Even though we hurt them, we still lost. I got a lot of blame because I'd said before the match that Shane Warne and Glenn McGrath were too old and past it. And those two had a fantastic match. But we took the positives out of it - if you can take 20 wickets like we did, you can win a game of cricket."



3RD TEST, OLD TRAFFORD 11-15 Aug, 2005, match drawn

"It was mad, there were 10,000 people outside the ground who couldn't get in. Ricky Ponting played a fantastic captain's innings to save the Test for them we had one wicket to get but just couldn't get over the line. At the end of the match, Michael Vaughan took us all into the centre and pointed at the Aussie dressing room. They were celebrating. He said, 'Look at them, the mighty Australians, celebrating a draw against England. We've got them by the dingdang-doos.' If it hadn't been for the weather, we'd have won it, at a place where they normally steamrollered us. That was a turning point. We realised that they weren't robots, that they weren't unbeatable. It was massive.'



5TH TEST, THE OVAL 8-12 Sept, match drawn. England win series.

"Before the match, I felt horrible, because the series was now ours to lose and that brings with it an entirely different kind of pressure. I mean, there was already talk of this open-top bus parade through the middle of London but I was thinking, 'F**king hell, hang on! We ain't done owt yet!' But then came Kevin Pietersen and, well, 'nuff said, really - he played some outrageous shots, and in his debut series as well. Shane Warne dropped him, and although Shane got 40 wickets in the series and averaged about 40 with the bat, he dropped that vital catch. Kev, and also Ashley Giles, lest we forget, put us in a position we couldn't lose from. And that was it. We'd won back the Ashes!



"Before the match started, Glenn McGrath stood on a ball and got carried off with an ankle injury. Everyone was like, 'He could be out for the series!' We scored 400 in a day but the latter stages should have been a lot easier. There was a group of Australians counting down the runs all morning. It started out as, 'Ah, they're counting down, what a joke!' then 'Ah sh*t, they only need ten runs to win!' Eventually, Geraint Jones and Steve Harmison got rid of last man Michael Kasprowicz. You know that iconic picture of Andrew Flintoff with Brett Lee that was seen as an advert for sportsmanship? It was actually Freddie saying, 'That's one-all, you Aussie b*stard, now let's get to the next match!'



4TH TEST, TRENT BRIDGE 25-28 Aug, England win by three wickets

"Well, you've got to mention our fielder, Gary Pratt, who ran out Ricky Ponting. Hilarious! I've got a picture of Ponting turning round to have a go at our huddle and me and Ashley Giles are pointing back at the pavilion, saving, 'F**k off!' When Geraint Jones tried to slap Shane Warne over the top and got caught at mid-off. I could've punched him when he came off the pitch. But I stepped over the white line and suddenly everything felt really calm. I thought to myself, 'Right, you need 13 runs, that's nothing, you can edge that.' Then my batting partner, Ashley Giles, said, 'Shane Warne's turning it both ways and Brett Lee's bowling at 90mph.' And so I was sh*tting it again, thanks to him!"

"He's been a little bit short of runs and had a funny series against New Zealand recently. He'll be as determined as ever against the Aussies, though, because they targeted him as a bit weak, character-wise, but that made him work on that area of himself and he now knows that he deserves to be there."



"Jimmy Anderson is a very skilful attack leader with 300 wickets to his name, but Stuart Broad and Steven Finn are as good - fit and strong. The whole bowling attack is on song - there's an element of the classic '00s McGrath-Gillespie-Lee pace attack that Australia had. The best attack in the world!"



R WICKETKEEPER

"The best wicketkeeper-batsman in the world, and he's just getting better. He's a leader of that late middle order, with an average in the mid-40s - good enough to be in there as a batsman in his own right. His keeping is much better - nobody's talking about it, and that's a good thing!"



BOWLER

"Swanny came back from his elbow injury like he's never been away - definitely another 'best in the world' in his area. Australia have lots of left-handers in their top seven and his record against lefties speaks for itself. He can also hit the ball late on in the England innings if needed. A natural leader, too.'
