
DAWN OF THE PLANET OF THE APES



period, let's set a comedy then." It was more practical. Firstly, we're men - sort of. We wanted the other main parts to be female so it seemed like a funny idea to set it in that period. Simon: I think their reason for not commissioning it was that The Inbetweeners was on constant repeat on Channel 4, I'd done Friday Night Dinner and Joe was in Fresh Meat. So they probably didn't want four shows with us in them.

You live together in Chickens. Have you lived together before?

Joe: We lived together after uni, with [Chickens co-writer and star Jonny Sweet. There were three of us but we had a two-bedroom flat so I said I'd have the living room as my bedroom. I'd come home and they'd be watching TV in my bedroom. I had to hang out in the bathroom instead.

Could Chickens be as successful as The Inbetweeners?

Simon: It's hard to judge. We didn't think The Inbetweeners would get anywhere. It was the first comedy E4 had done. We thought, "It's only E4. Let's not get carried away."

Joe: I didn't think anyone watched it apart from people who somehow knew my mum or dad. I thought, "That doesn't count. I want some total strangers who I don't know." Simon: We didn't know if it would be recommissioned after the first series. Joe went back to tutoring. I went back to my PhD. James [Buckley] fitted kitchens. Blake [Harrison] went to work at the scare chamber at Madame Tussauds. That's true. The buzz only started after the second series.








Missed lunch!

A split-second later, the massive, gaping jaws of a pair of 40 tonne humpback whales pierce the water - gloriously synchronised - just feet from one of the now furiously panicking Shawn Stamback and Francis Antigua.

"I had a feeling the whales knew where we were in the water so missed us intentionally – which is pretty lucky, as I was right in the middle of the meatball!" joked Shawn Stamback, the man nearest the whales, who almost certainly lost about half a stone during the incident. Phew!









Two Aston concept cars!

Aston Martin continues its 100th birthday celebrations with a brace of Zagato concepts!

- It's been a couple of weeks and we've not had a new Aston Martin, so here we've got two! As the company's 100th anniversary celebrations continue, Italian coachbuilder Zagato is joining the party with two custom Astons, based on the DBS and DB9.
- Zagato has been making special rebodied versions of
- existing Aston models for over 50 years, and this pair continue in that vein. The hardtop – Coupé Zagato Centennial – is based on the DBS, while the cabriolet, called the Spyder Zagato, started life as a DB9.
- The coupé isn't your usual DBS, with its bizarre in-board headlights integrated into





a gaping front grille. A Zagato tradition is the double-bubble rear roof glass, which the DBS Zag has. And there's a metal strip that starts along each door, then kicks up over the top of the back window.

 An S-shaped swoop is repeated on the side profile of the rear end, continuing across the top of the boot lid as a spoiler lip. Below that, there are teardrop-shaped back lights, then below that a pair of frowning exhaust tips inside a fanged diffuser panel.

 Despite this leftfield bodywork, the giveaway that it's a DBS is the standard cabin and 20in alloys. The engine's a 510bhp 5.9-litre V12, good for 62mph in 4.3 secs and a 190mph top end.

The drop-top is the DB9
 Spyder Zagato Centennial,
 which wears almost identical
 styling to the coupé. Being
 a fabric-roofed car, there's
 no curvy bubble top, and the
 Spyder retains its hallmark
 Aston side intake grilles on
 the front wings.

 As this is a DB9 Volante, there's a 5,935cc V12 at the front and 510bhp travel through the back wheels. It does 0-62 in 4.6 secs, with a top speed of 183mph.

 There are no plans to make any more – they're both one of one. So they'd cost more than ten regular Astons apiece.

Nuts explores the life and crimes of Miguel Treviño Morales, Mexico's most-feared gangster

H

E WAS the crime boss who left hundreds

leader Miguel

of beheaded bodies by the roadside and had rivals hanged from motorway bridges or burned alive in oil

drums. But on 15 July, Miguel Angel Treviño Morales' reign of terror came to an end when he was captured by Mexican Marines near the US border. The 40-year-old leader of the bloodthirsty Los Zetas cartel was stopped with almost £2million in cash and eight guns in the back of his pickup. Now, after being charged with murder, torture and kidnap, *Nuts* looks back on the life of one of the world's cruellest and most powerful drug kingpins...

THE BEGINNINGS

In true *Goodfellas* style, the young Morales washed cars and ran errands as a teenager for the Los Tejas gang, and later the Gulf cartels. Around the time, he became known by the nickname Z-40 and was appointed boss of the deadly Loz Zetas gang, a powerful crime syndicate that had been founded by former Mexican commandos. Under his watch, the gang expanded from drug dealing into people trafficking, extortion and kidnapping across Mexico.

THE SLAUGHTER

Those who refused to work for Morales as drug mules were slaughtered. In 2010, the bodies of 72 men were found in the town of San Fernando and in 2011, Mexican police found the remains of 192 bodies – all buried in the sand – believed to be migrants who'd tried to resist being press-ganged into working as drug traffickers for the Zeta gang.

THE VIOLENCE

Under Morales, the Los Zetas gang defeated other cartels in bloody shootouts and spread throughout the country, eventually infiltrating towns which had never seen organised crime. Morales' reputation was spreading too, as stories of his murderous methods became legendary. Members of Los Zetas would often drive ice picks through the chests of their victims and



leave signs on the corpse warning people not to interfere with their work. Morales' most sadistic method of disposing of his victims was to force them into 55 gallon oil drums and then set them alight. Morales referred to this technique as the "guiso" or "stew-in".

THE RISE TO POWER

"If you get called to a meeting with him, you're not going to come out of that meeting," said one US law-enforcement official in Mexico City. Those who hurt Morales' friends came in for particularly harsh treatment. Morales remained allied with the Gulf cartel until, in 2010, a faction kidnapped his friend Víctor Peña Mendoza, who was beaten and executed for refusing to defect from Los Zetas. Morales ordered revenge kidnappings and the murders of 16 Gulf cartel members – igniting a cartel war. Police suspect up to 70,000 people have been killed as a result.

THE FIGHTBACK

When Mexican President Peña Nieto came to power last year, he swore he'd confront the crime wave head on and launched a new special force known as the National Gendarmerie to battle the cartels. With a current force of just 5,000 men, though, experts believe the force have a tough fight on their hands, and Mexico's streets are still policed in large parts by the military.

THE FUTURE

The arrest of Morales, along with his bodyguard and chief of finance, who were both travelling in the pickup truck with him at the time, has led some experts to speculate that perhaps it won't be long before the most infamous drug lord of them all, Sinaloa cartel head Joaquin "El Chapo" Guzmán will soon meet a similar fate. Others, however, believe that Morales' arrest means the power of "El Chapo" will only increase. "El Chapo is greatly strengthened," said Professor George Grayson, an expert on Los Zetas, who thinks he could take over Morales' empire. If he tries, though, it won't be without more bloodshed. Morales' brother Omar, who is thought to be just as ruthless, looks set to succeed his sibling as leader of the Los Zetas gang. The terror, it would seem, is far from over.



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


ROYSTON DRENTHE READING
