I'm 6 foot 8 and I'm available. I'm not sure dressing as an alien super monkey would be a career high or a career low. But if they ring me, let's talk!



Canadian Magnum Mk5 track monster!

"Finitroducing the Magnun Mk5 – it's half a stash my Toblerones!" tonne of corking Canuck firepower!

- Faster than the paw of a starving grizzly bear, or the jumping salmon it's trying to catch, the Magnum Mk5 is the least luxurious, lightest car to fill your mouth with insects you can buy in North America.
- With a front end that mimics the helmeted face of the Predator itself, the Magnum fires some fierce statistic figures at its rivals (namely KTM's X-Bow, Ariel's Atom, the BAC Mono and good ol'
- Caterham) like: 0 to 60mph in 3.2 seconds, 150mph top end, 545kg in weight and 2G of neck-ruining lateral cornering force. Fear the Magnum, don't lick it.
- Magnum is a company with roots in motor sport since it was founded in 1968. It built single-seater racers for the likes of Gilles Villeneuve and has worked in conjunction with F1 teams including Lotus, Williams and Renault.



- Because it's mostly made from carbon fibre, and because it doesn't have stuff like a windscreen, roof, doors, carpet or satnav, it produces 460bhp per tonne. Which is rather a lot.
- To achieve that massive figure, the car only needs a 247bhp all-alloy fourcylinder engine, which originally came from a Suzuki Hayabusa superbike and lives behind the seats. And being a bike engine,

it'll scream to an eyesquinting 11,000rpm.

- The power's fed through a six-speed sequential gearbox that delivers the car's drive to the back wheels. Gears are shifted via a traditional stick shifter rather than paddles. There's also a limited slip diff (for drifting, should you find a bagful of brave pills) and F1-style adjustable pushrod suspension.
- Sitting a smidge over a metre high, it's fair to say

the Magnum's a track dayfocused motor with the bare
necessities to comply with
road legality. Drop into the
exposed cockpit and you'll
be greeted with carbon
seats, suede-wrapped
removable steering wheel
(with GPS lap-timer/data
logger), six-point harnesses,
custom pedal box and a
reversing camera instead
of wing mirrors.

 Styling of the hardcore Canadian is strictly dictated by Formula One and Le Mans aerodynamics and downforce. It's all about achieving savage lap times, not impressing Rihanna, nor cruising about in Chelsea in the rain.







How come you get lots of singing on X Factor and Britain's Got Talent, but never any rap?



When enjoying jam at home, do you label your preserves "MistaJam's jam" to stop other people from helping themselves?


I don't. But I am in conversation with a jam purveyor to bring out my own range of jams. That may or may not be true.

to get some sleep.





















RAMED FOR smuggling drugs, Dubliner Paul Keany was sentenced to eight vears in Venezuela's notorious Los Teques prison – where beatings. shoot-outs and murders are a daily occurrence. Here's his account of his time inside hell on earth.

Hi Paul. What happened the moment you realised you were going to be locked up in Venezuela?

Everything comes down on you in a split second. I wasn't so worried about myself, it was more my family. When I saw the amount of drugs that had been put in the suitcase, I was nearly sick. That was it. Sentenced to eight vears. In Venezuela it doesn't mater what amount you're caught with, or what crime you do... even if you murder someone, the sentence is the same.

What was your first impression of Los Teques?

It was like a human zoo. Everyone was dressed in rags. It was like walking onto a pirate ship. I soon discovered that the living conditions would be terrible. It was a concrete shell made for 400, but when I arrived there were 1,200. The worst thing was the toilet. It was just a hole in the floor. If you didn't want to wait, you went in a plastic bag.

What were your personal quarters like?

Grim. On one occasion, a spider laid eggs under my skin. That was like a horror film. This little spider laid some eggs in me and they just festered. By the time I got them taken out, there was a growth the size of an egg.

As an Irishman, how were you treated?

I was actually one of about 250 "foreigners". Los Teques was one of the few prisons deemed fit for foreigners. That just made me think, "I wouldn't want to see how hellish the other places were." The locals would try to extort money from us – most people think Westerners all have big cars and houses. When I arrived, I was pulled into a room and threatened with a machete. They said, "Call home, get money, or you get this instead."

Wasn't that something the guards could protect you from?

Well, you didn't see much of them and they didn't have guns. It was up to the prisoners to handle security. The prisoners were armed with knives and shanks, and bought guns and ammo from the soldiers patrolling the perimeter. One of the



inmates was a gun runner. He could get anything you wanted, even behind bars. If you had the money to pay for it.

You were caught up in shoot-outs in there. How bad were they?

Terrifying. The worst part was the noise. When it kicked off I just ducked down, put my hands over my ears and hoped for the best. All the killing and maiming became normal after a while.

Some Russian mobsters put a hit out on you...

Yes, I bought some hooch [DIY alcohol]. One of them owed me money from another time, so I took it out of the amount I paid for their hooch. It seemed reasonable to me, but they disagreed. I went to my wing boss and asked him to sort it out before it got nasty. I came out of it all right. Generally, foreigners don't tend to get hurt too badly because it causes a whole diplomatic stink everyone can do without. Others weren't so lucky, though...

Did you ever see anyone get murdered?

I was going to dinner once and one of the foot soldiers on my wing got stabbed. You could tell it was a professional hit. He was dead in 20 seconds.

How regular were such acts of horror?

There was one day we nicknamed "Bloody Sunday", when a gun battle broke out during a visit. Visit days were supposed to be sacred. But one day, two people had an argument, it all escalated, and pretty soon seven or eight lay dead, including a couple of visitors.

What's this we read about enforced hunger strikes in Venezuelan jails?

Yes, that's called "huelga de hambre". They do it every now and again. It's a protest against prison conditions. I didn't eat anything for nine days. I wasn't allowed to. If you were caught, they'd break your legs. There were a lot of guys walking around like penguins. After a while, I understood why.

How did you eventually come to be released?

I got early parole after two years. I had to prove myself a model prisoner, and pass oral and psychological tests in Spanish. They let me out and put me on bail. So I legged it. I bribed a cop at a checkpoint to let me cross the border into Colombia. Then I went to the embassy there and told them I had my passport stolen. They gave me an emergency replacement and I got a plane back to Ireland. Altogether, it took 12 days.


What went through your mind when you knew you'd made it out?

To finally get back to Dublin was amazing, but I was one of the lucky ones. Now there's no such thing as parole there. It's an experience that's had lasting effects on me. I was told that I was suffering from posttraumatic stress disorder, but it's something I've been getting help with. When I told the counsellor my story he asked for a signed copy of my book!

Be honest, have you ever photocopied your bottom at an office party?




Do you think you're nailed on for that plane heading to Brazil for the World Cup?



More likely, he'll be back in the Manchester City team.

But if you speak to goalkeeping greats – Peter Shilton, David Seaman, Ray Clemence – they'll all tell you that they went through what Joe's going through.

Joe's real problem is that he's not playing for Celtic or Norwich, he's playing for Manchester City and he isn't allowed to make any mistakes. But mistakes are part of the maturing process and goalkeepers use them to help them get better.

I have no fears for Joe, and England fans should feel the same way.

I WAS very surprised by the announcement of Martin O'Neill and Roy Keane as the Republic of Ireland's new management team. I honestly didn't think I'd ever see Roy Keane as anyone's number two. But the Republic of Ireland is his country.

I know he let them down at the 2002 World Cup by walking out on them, that was criminal. And maybe that's Roy's thinking – he can't just stroll back as the country's number one, he has to work to win the fans' trust back.

One way to do that is to work alongside someone as experienced as Martin O'Neill. His willingness to learn how to be a good international manager may just be what wins his nation's fans back.


What on Earth was Andrea Dossena thinking?






