












'It's probably quite safe!'

Nuts grabs surfing mentalist Andrew Cotton for a chat!



Hi Andrew! That's some picture, there. Is it the world's biggest ever surfed wave?

Well that's what people are saying. Who knows? I think if it looks bigger, then it's bigger! We'll find out for sure in May!

What does it feel like to surf a wave that big?

It's amazing! That's why I do it, and that's why I do it over and over again. It's why I've devoted my life to doing it. Every wave's different. People have asked me, is this it, then? You've surfed the biggest wave ever. But it's so unlike, for instance, a mountain climber. A climber can climb the biggest mountain ever, and then it's done. He's done it. But surfing's not like that. There aren't any larger mountains coming along any time soon! You never know. There's a massive storm coming this weekend. And I might ride a bigger wave. That's really exciting, and it keeps you on your toes. You've always got to be on it. You've always got to be fit, be focussed. The possibilities of the unknown, that's exciting!

Did you have time to enjoy it, or are you so "in the moment" that you can't?

Yeah, I enjoy every second I'm riding a wave. Every second I'm surfing and I'm in those situations, I've got to be thankful for. I feel really lucky. I love it, you know.

Are you brave, or foolish? I don't think it's either. I don't see myself as brave.

It's just calculated risks. For instance, I'm quite a keen cyclist and some of my mates hammer down hills at, like, God knows what speed, with Lycra on! And I think that's pretty foolish, right? What if you fall off? I'm always the slowest down the hills. Always the slowest. I could get really hurt! I can't think of anything worse than falling off your bike dressed in Lycra! Not only is it going to be embarrassing, but it's going to really hurt. But my mates are comfortable doing that, they're happy to do it.

In real terms, how dangerous is surfing waves this size?

Well, I think if you look at the statistics, it's probably quite safe. People do drown, but not that many, really! It's relatively safe. I've got a young family, and I would never put myself in unnecessary risk for a photo, or for anything. I've got nothing to prove to anyone. No big, headline sponsor backing me, telling me I've got to do this, to get my money, I'm just doing it for love. Because it makes me happy.

How do they work out the size of the wave?

That's decided by the judges at the Billabong XXL committee, who use the top guys to measure that wave. They look at photos and video footage, and work it out. They are the official, Guinness adjudicators.

Would you be fussed if it wasn't the world's biggest?

I'm not going to lie, it's great for the media! OK, yeah, I am, I want to surf big waves. That's my mission, to surf big waves, regularly.

Thanks, Nick! Finally, is there anything else you like doing?



Canadian supercar!

This angular beauty from Canada, the Felino CB7, has Corvette's new Stingray in its sights!

- Four years in the making, and from the wintry wilds of Canada this, the Felino CB7, is the Canuck answer to Britain's Morgan AeroMax. With a throbbing, natural breathing V8 motor up front and a flowing Beetle-back at the rear, it's a ground-up purposebuilt two-seat sports car designed for track use, but, in Felino's words, "potentially street legal".
- The CB7 boasts the magical 50/50 weight distribution and, at 4,191mm long and

- 1,930mm wide, is broader than Ferrari's California and some 60cm shorter than a Lambo Aventador.
- It has the face of an angry robot, and front wheel arches swelling well proud of the nostril-littered bonnet. Unusually for a sports car, the door windows are large,
- and the doors themselves sweep up into the broad dominating rear arches. At the back, there's a long split rear window and tapered tail into which the rear LED lights, integral spoiler and protruding diffuser all pout.
- As standard, the Felino features a moulded-carbon driver's seat, six-point safety harnesses, removable steering wheel and on-board data acquisition hardware. It also comes with side and rear view cameras.
- Performance stats are as yet undisclosed, but we're sure this will be a mid threesecond to 62 chariot. Why?
- Well, the new shape Corvette C7 Stingray weighs 1,499kg, and with 454bhp, the base model will get to 62 in 4.2 secs and up to 195mph. We're willing to bet the Felino uses a similar 6.2-litre V8, together with its six-speed manual cog box. Don't forget, the CB7 has more power (525bhp) and less flab (1,135kg), see?



THE AMAZING UNBREAKABLE MAN!

He swapped being bored and skint for the world's toughest challenges...



NDURANCE ADVENTURER Sean Conway, 32, has spent the last five years conquering the world. He's cycled the globe, he became the first person to swim the length of the British Isles and now plans to run across Africa. Here, Gloucester-based Sean tells Nuts how he pushed himself beyond his physical and mental limits to achieve these impossible goals.

Hello Sean. Tell us a little bit about your background...

I used to be photographer but became disillusioned and ended up selling half of my business for a pound! It sounds ridiculous, but I hit a bit of a life-crisis in my late 20s and was looking for a change in direction. Fairly soon, I was flat broke and had no way of making a living. It was only then that I decided to take the plunge and do something completely different with my life.

To go on crazy adventures?

I suppose! I was always fascinated by people who climbed Everest, trekked to the North and South Poles. or walked across deserts. But I didn't think it was something I could ever do myself. I thought you needed lots of money, which actually isn't the case. Around this time. I discovered that the round-the-world record for cycling had just been broken - part of me was thinking, "What if you could beat that?" It seemed ridiculous at first but after working out the distances, routes and how much ground I would need to cover per day, I decided to go for it.

How did you train?

I don't have much of an athletic background, so it was difficult. But I worked with nutritionists and endurance trainers, and after six months, I was managing 200



miles per day with the weight of my supplies on my back.

We hear you got seriously injured. What happened?

Everything was going well – I got good sponsors and was averaging 180 miles a day, which was well above world-record pace. But during the American leg, I got run over by a pickup truck, leaving me with whiplash, concussion and torn ligaments in my leg, neck and ankle. But the worst injury was a compression fracture to my spine. After several weeks, my doctor said I could continue the race but it would be agony.

So you continued to cycle with a broken back?

Yeah! I dropped my pace, took painkillers and kept going. Looking back, I'm just glad the truck hit me from behind, because it threw me into the air rather than going straight under the vehicle.

Your next challenge was swimming from Land's End to John O' Groats...

I posted on open sea swimming forums seeking information on tides, currents and techniques, but received a lot of negativity. People said it was a publicity stunt, that I was going to get sucked under by a whirlpool or would get eaten alive by a killer whale. I discovered that I'd be restricted to swimming for just six hours a day because it's impossible to swim when the tide is against you. This meant the

race would be less strenuous but also that I'd be in the water for much longer.

Tell us a bit about the physical toll of the swim...

First off, I was physically unprepared. I spent so much time looking for sponsorship that I didn't have time to do any sea training. Also, I had to consume 8,000 calories a day to give myself enough energy, but my weight still dropped to below 10 stone because I was pushing myself so hard for four-anda-half months. The cold saltwater made my jaw freeze and tongue swell. I had to start blending all my meals and drink them out of a puree bottle to get the calories in.

What adverse conditions did you encounter?

Plenty of whirlpools, but I planned my routes to avoid them. Jellyfish were another problem, so I grew a beard to stop them stinging my face. The weather was the biggest obstacle though. Days before the planned end of the race our team got hit by a freak storm and we lost most of our equipment. The support boat almost sank because it took on so much water. I was terrified that we were going to have to give up.

What kept you going?

My main motivation was proving all the people wrong who told me I couldn't do it. Failure was never an option. Even at our lowest moments, the crew and I were joking

about what we were going to do when we arrived at John O' Groats. But that last leg was gruelling. When we arrived, there were journalists and news vans waiting for us – it was surreal.

How have your mates reacted to your adventuring ways?

If we're at the pub and someone asks, "Sean, what do you do?" my mates just groan – they know it's going to be a long conversation!

What's the next challenge?

I'm planning to do an endurance run now. I'll be taking on the length of Africa in 2015. The distance is equal to 250 marathons and I aim to complete it in eight months. In terms of difficulty, it will rival the swim but the truth is we're all a lot more physically and mentally capable than we think we are. I've learned that first hand.







Footballers don't understand that they're rich, so the only thing left for them to do is to cement a legacy. That's worth



Alan Curbishley to work with him and has been backed in the transfer market.


This is a situation where the board must publicly back their man, because as it stands, it's not looking good for him.

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
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


