

I'm a good laugh, for sure.



200mph drop top Corvette!

Chevy take the tin opener to their Stingray. Rooney – you'll need some stronger glue!

- Chevrolet has just tugged the motorshow sheets off the topless version of its C7 Z06 Corvette Stingray to prove it's aiming its exhaust barrels at the likes of Porsche's 911 Turbo cabrio.
- The Z06 convertible is built on the same rigid aluminium chassis structure with carbon and plastic bodywork as its hard-topped cousin. No extra bracing was required once the top was lopped off, as Chevy designed the car to be open-topped from square one.
- This means the cabrio is barely any heavier, so you can expect a top speed of over 200mph and a 0-60 dash of 3.5 secs. This snaps at the heels of Lambos, and is a Ferrari contender for a fraction of the price.

- You can choose between a seven-speed manual (which cleverly blips the throttle for you on the downshift) or eight-cog paddle autobox, which Chevy technicians say shifts up gears "up to 0.08 secs quicker than that of Porsche's PDK double clutch box." Serious stuff.
- The only visible difference between this and the hard top Z06 is the fabric roof. This can be operated remotely with a blip from the key fob or while driving up to 30mph. Once down, it's completely hidden beneath a body coloured, dual hump hard tonneau cover.
- Inside, the Z06 has a flatbottomed steering wheel, CGI instrument panel and interior materials that, for the first time in decades, give the Corvette the cabin quality the rest of the car deserved. Like magnesium seat frames,

Napa leather and real lacquered carbon fibre.

- Probably the best slice of gadgetry is an industry-first Performance Data Recorder. This allows you to log your hooning activities via video, audio, GPS and driving stats. The data's captured on an SD card in the glove box and onboard accelerometers allow you to analyse every mile. You
- can even relive your moment of drift/ drag/crash glory on a touchscreen 8in HD screen.
- If you still need convincing that the Yanks can build a world-class supercar with sledgehammer spec and build quality, the ZO6 is exactly that. You'd struggle to spend a better £75k on a car this year.

Hi Seth! In your ace new film you face off with a frat house

Yeah, if you just act normally, the scene is so ridiculous that it's funny. That's the best place to be when you're not relying on verbal intricacies for laughter. The situations themselves are funny.

And there are a lot of moments in the film that require, ahem, large man bits. Was there a dedicated prosthetics team?

There actually was a prosthetics team on the movie! There were also a lot of prosthetic butts, although you only see a few of them... There was every prosthetic body part you can have!

Nice! How do you psyche yourself up for shooting your sex scenes with Rose Byrne and her spatula?

It is a little awkward. The fact that it's funny makes it a lot less weird. Sex scenes are generally always a little weird.

Tell us about the party scenes...

They were all shot in houses.

There were a few moments with little sequences in the movie where it looks like you're actually walking around at the party! We gave out cameras to the background people in the scenes, and Evan Goldberg (Rogen's co-writer on

Superbad) and I went around with little cameras as well.
Sometimes, if they were shooting in the other house, we would have a hundred people in the frat house with music playing telling people to just party for ten minutes and we'd film it.
It was crazy and really fun!

TAG Heuer launches mobile that never needs charging!




Have you already started the ol' bikini shopping?


Spare a Line thought for Hyde FC!

After 43 games, their league record read: played 43, won one, drew seven, lost 35, goal difference of -77. So, if think your team's having a tough run-in, just ponder these facts. They're enough to make anyone run and Hyde...

- Hyde were relegated on 11 March, after a 3-0 defeat to Alfreton. With three matches to go they were 35 points from safely and 23 adrift of the team directly above them.
- After two league games, their goal record stood at one scored, 13 conceded.
- Their home fans have not seen them win this season. They've managed three home

- draws, but were dumped out of the FA Trophy at home by North Ferriby United.
- Their only victory, 2-0 against Welling, came on 14 January, 28 league games and 137 days into the season.
- They lost all their games in September, October and December.






mean to go off to the World
