You take a picture of two people that run into each other on the red carpet at a certain angle, it looks like they're kind of boo'd up or they're kind of having an intimate moment and you can basically place any caption under a picture and make the story what you want it to be. I've definitely found myself the victim of that, and you've got all these ridiculous liaisons with these people you may have just been meeting in passing.

At the end of the day, celebs have real lives, and real people they deal with and family members and relationships. When you have a lot of cameras on you and are constantly being photographed, they're gonna catch you in a moment where it may look like it's more than what it is, and a lot of the times it's innocent.

How do you deal with rumors that get out there about you, whether they're true or not? How do you keep the peace within yourself?

It's funny... I've actually dated people in my real life that would have been newsworthy, but I've been really private with it. But the ones they put me with are not the people I've dated, and it's like they'd have a way more interesting story if they put the truth instead of someone they see me at an event with. We kind of laugh at it sometimes like, "Wow, if they'd only knew what we knew. The real deal."

I think because I've been so private, it makes people more likely to jump the gun like, "That must be who she's with!" I mean I went and got married without anyone knowing, so I know how to keep a relationship private. When I was younger I wanted to put everything on MySpace and stake my claim, and I've learned from one relationship that once you start doing that, you open yourself up to everyone's opinion - and if it's someone a lot of women are crushing on, your relationship will be destroyed.

Not everyone is strong enough to go through that and deal with the nonsense, and social media has been really terrible for a lot of relationships. The traits that I seek in a mate are people who are like very kind of independently thinking, not influenced by that, and they're all man. Like all that stuff doesn't really affect them. That's hard to find now, but it's definitely out there.

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How did getting on "Real Housewives of Atlanta" affect your life in terms of your privacy?

When I got on Housewives, it's just amazing how different people can interpret scenes to be different things to them, depending on who their favorite is on the show. You get into it with someone they like, they hate you and they go for the jugular. It's not just, "Hey Claudia, I don't like that scene you did with such and such." It's, "I hate you. I hope you die. I hope your mom gets hit by a car and your ass gets kidnapped!" They go so hard. People are very emotional and involved and invested in reality shows, and it's amazing—and also, when they love you, they ride so hard for you. You've got to take it for what it is and with a grain of salt.

Have you embraced the fact that people love your snappy, witty sense of "reading"?

I have, but people that know me know that's just how I am. I really am a fighter of what's right, and if I see someone else getting disrespected on my time if I'm around, I kind of feel like a champion of justice. I know that sounds kind of funny, but when I saw how wrong Demetria was being treated and how mean the girls were being to her, I kind of felt like I had to say something. It really wasn't much about me, but I can't sit there and watch someone get bullied right in front of me and just let it ride.

People thought that was such a read, but I was on the Foxxhole for four years with Jamie Foxx and that was mild compared to some of the stuff we would do on that show. When you do a radio show with comedic geniuses such as Jamie Foxx, you've got to come with you're A-game every single Friday. When people are like "Oh my God you read the hell out of such and such..." or whatever I'm like, "Oh, okay. I felt I was just getting things off my chest."

What are some goals for you within the next year? Well, I'm working on a fitness apparel line. I'm gonna work on a skin care line. I have two films I did, one that is called *The Hills* and one is called *Love Is Not Enough*. I've gotten offers for three more. I'm shooting one in two weeks.

It's funny because that was something that was said to me in Puerto Rico [on RHOA] that Hollywood wasn't checking for me. Hollywood started to check for me a whole lot lately. It's kind of been poetic justice in some kind of way. I feel like if you stay humble, stay the course, and focus on what you should be doing, the right things that are supposed to be for you will come to you. I'm really excited about that.

There's a travel show I wanted to do, and I have a producer that's been talking to me about that. There are so many things on the table. Right now, it's a matter of finding the time to do everything. I'm so very grateful and blessed right now.

The Virgin Islands' Reggae Ambassador

he kneejerk reaction for any entry level Reggae fan is to assume it all comes from Jamaica. That's far from the case, as Reggae artist Pressure is a legend in his own right and isn't from Jamaican soil. The singer hails from St. Thomas, of the U.S. Virgin Islands. The music specific to St. Thomas is a hybrid of many sounds, including Calypso and the aforementioned Reggae. But for Pressure, he treated Reggae like a student, studying it to perfection. Now with his project Lovers Rock, he hopes to continue in that progression as he has over the years. We checked in with Pressure while he was in Miami and he discussed his past, present and future.

Black Men: What is the music scene like in St. Thomas? Pressure: Well, the music scene in the Virgin Islands is multicultural. We're dominated by Calypso, Reggae Music, and of course American culture like Rap and R&B. We're under the United States, so we're an American territory. We're well-rounded where music is concerned, but mostly for the culture of the Virgin Islands it's Calypso and Reggae music.

When you combine those two worlds, it takes on a whole other dimension sonically.

Definitely. For me, I have studied the Reggae culture of Jamaica and the Dancehall culture from a very young age. I'm one of the few that really took Reggae music seriously coming from the Virgin Islands. I'm making a name for myself internationally, and still being able to be in the Virgin Islands. I'm still pushing to really get the music on a higher level. It's moving very good and very fast. I'm loving it and working diligently to bring a good name to the Virgin Islands and put them on the map for great music.

What made you get involved with Reggae on such a graduated level?

Well, Reggae music is to me the poor and the have nots. I came from the ghetto, and Reggae music spoke to me in ways that a lot of other music couldn't. When you listen to certain Reggae artists' songs, it relates to you coming from the streets, coming from the ghetto—uplifting you to find ways to get out of that state of mind. Reggae music has helped me spiritually and mentally. I just felt like it was my rightful place.

How did you take your first step to fame?

I was a drummer in high school, and

I always wanted to do something with music. I wasn't doing too well in school, so my mom took me out of the Virgin Islands and sent me to live with my uncle in America—Georgia to be exact—to stay in school and be more focused on my academics. When I got to Georgia, I wasn't doing too good in school there either, so my uncle took me out of all of my musical activities. I couldn't play my drums or any other instruments. Being that I was into Reggae music and knew all of the music from my favorite artists, I just started writing my own music and started to sing. At a time when I didn't have my drums or a trumpet, I decided to try something different. My friends supported me very much and told me to keep it up, so I did just that. More and more I started getting support from friends, people would hear about me and the community started to pay more attention until I became an artist that people learned to love.

When did your efforts start paying off?

The first album I recorded was *The Pressure Is On*, which got me a lot of good reviews on the internet and my community. People really loved it. My music was heard by Don Corleon, who is the platinum producer, and at the time was producing for Vybz Kartel and Sizzla. He had hit songs on MTV with Keyshia Cole and Sean Paul. When he reached out to me to do some work because he loved my first album, it was like a big happy moment for me. It was a stepping stone for me. He sent me a lot of riddims, like 13 riddims. He was sure he wanted to work with me. The first track was "Love And Affection," which gave me almost immediate recognition. I was getting calls from all over the world. My MySpace page was lit up! Within a month I had my first concert in the Bahamas.

You've managed to go completely beyond "Love And Affection," though. So let's talk about Lovers Rock.

Well, I'm actually out here in Miami finishing it up and it's going really well. I released "Nuh Worry Yourself" and that's been doing well, especially in the Virgin Islands. The rest of the album—we have songs produced by Don Corleon, a song called "Once Again" on the island roots riddim. There are a lot of things happening right now where Lovers Rock is concerned, and I'm grateful to have Malik Yoba and Claudia Jordan to be a part of the video for "Nuh Worry Yourself" as well. I really feel like this album will make a statement for all Lovers Rock lovers. This is the first time that I'm trying an album like this. The last two albums that I released weren't really that romantic. My female fans have



been requesting it, saying, "You forgot about us." I took that into perspective and felt like now was the time to really show them that we haven't gone anywhere. The love for the people, especially the women, is still there.

When you're not making music, you're also a cultural ambassador for the U.S. Virgin Islands Board Of Tourism?

It is just that. I'm the type of person where people give me all kinds of titles and names [*laughs*]. They said I'm the Ghetto Governor, I'm the Virgin Islands Ambassador. I just want to be what the people want me to be. I just want to be true

to the people. It's a good feeling to have people acknowledge you and put you on a high pedestal, but I never wanna be better than the people. You know? I'm not that person. I like to communicate with people and say hi and take a picture here and there because I'm a human. When I was young, we didn't have much of that in the community. So to me, being that I have gotten all of this popularity, I like coming back to the community where they can feel your presence and your skin. I'm all for that.

Growing up in a military family where everyone from your father to your siblings and even your cousins and nephews are servicemen and women, you would think that you would eventually throw on a uniform and follow suit. This wasn't exactly what actor/director/writer/producer/instructor Shiek Mahmud-Bey had envisioned for his life's journey, though—neither was acting for that matter. In fact, according to Shiek, he thought he would one day become a million-dollar boxer. "I actually used to box. I was knocking cats out. My first fight was one minute and thirteen seconds of the first round!" he shared. However, a chance meeting with actor/director Adolph Caesar would soon put the Brooklyn, NY-born/Queens-raised actor on a different path, which would ultimately lead him to his life's true calling.

Early in life, Shiek's father—who was a sergeant major in the U.S. Army instilled in him discipline—which is key in acting—along with the mantra: "Bury the man, complete the mission." His mother, on the other hand, provided

him with artistic nourishment by taking Shiek, as well as other kids from their neighborhood, to Broadway plays and also held Music Appreciation Day every week where they all played musical choices from all different genres which they later discussed at the dining room table.

Years later, during Shiek's boxing days, his best friend—who was dating Adolph Caesar's daughter at the time—introduced Shiek to the actor/director. Caesar had already gained acclaim for his role as Sergeant Waters opposite Denzel Washington on the award-winning Off-Broadway play A Soldier's Play, and he was now opening a theatre company alongside fellow actors Roni Dengel and Fred Rolf. The Chameleons, as the company came to call themselves, would recruit kids from all over New York City and instruct them on the art of stage acting. They invited Shiek to join, and as he puts it, "...that's all she wrote, bro."

"I had to be there every Thursday or Tuesday in Harlem. And then, we used to work out of Adolph's brownstone. It was like 30 of us and I'm the only one still acting. That's where I got most of my training," Shiek said.

After some time working with The Chameleons, it was time for Shiek to test his acting chops. His first experience on stage was performing for a group of kids at the children's camp for the famous Hudson Guild Theatre in NYC.

"[The experience] was nice," he told us, but admitted that keeping their attention was the tricky part. "You wanted to say, 'Shut up! We're doing something over herel' [Laughs]. So, you learn to discipline yourself and using whatever is going on in the crowd and incorporating it into your acting. If there were cats yelling and screaming, then it would make me work harder to get their attention."

"Sometimes you can use improv—you'll blow your nose or something—and they'll be like, "Oooh!" and then you got them. Once you got them, you blow them away. That's when I knew that this was it for me," he added.

As time progressed so did Shiek's acting skills...so much so that he landed the role of boxer Rubin "Hurricane" Carter for the theatrical production of *The Way Out*—Denzel Washington played Carter in the film about the legendary boxer. Shiek garnered an award for Best Performance at the New York International Fringe Festival for his portrayal of Carter and his performance was noted as one that "will be remembered" by the New York Times. The New York Daily

News even went as far as saying, "Shiek's fierce performance goes a long way towards making audiences forget Denzel Washington."

Another of Shiek's roles that captivated audiences was that of a Catholic Priest who was accused of pedophilia in the sold out play *Acts of Contrition*—a role that he had to fight for as the producers initially wanted to cast Edward Norton for the role.

"That was one of the hardest roles I had to play, but it was one of those roles that I wanted to do, because you don't typically see a black bishop," Shiek stated.

"It was about a man fighting for balance. He made a promise to God that if you take care of me and keep me away from my weakness, then I'll be the best servant—and his weakness were kids, little boys. So, I had to break it down," he told us of the difficult role. Shiek's class is not one of those classes where you can come in and stick around for months without gaining anything from it, though. His classes are about results!

He broke it down to us like this: "It's an eight-week class—you can take it for 16 months, or even a third time. Now, by the third time you decide to re-up, before that third time is over, you have to book a job or you can't come back. I don't want professional students—I want professional actors. That's why so many people in my class are working.

Shiek's work is not only limited to the stage—he has also worked on TV shows and films alongside some of Hollywood's biggest names. He notes his work on the Sidney Lumet-directed 1997 film *Night Falls on Manhattan* as his breakout project. He worked with actors like Andy Garcia, Richard Dreyfuss and the late James Gandolfini for this film. Other stars Shiek has shared the spotlight with include Morgan Freeman, Philip Seymour Hoffman and Robert DeNiro.

When asked what are some things he's picked up from working with DeNiro, Shiek said, "I learned how to master the camera watching him. He's brilliant in front of the camera and he's intense. Once, he was having a heart attack and he did his work. He had his cardiologist on the set, and he broke it down. Every day I was so blessed to be on that set."

Another thing that he learned from DeNiro, as well as every other actor he's either worked with or has built bonds with—like Daniel Day-Lewis and Ving Rhames—is humility and, that at the end of the day, they're all just regular people.

"DeNiro is a person. Philip Seymour Hoffman was a person. I met [Laurence Fishburne] when he did *Thurgood*. I went up to the room and talked to him. The people that are brilliant and honest off the screen as well as on the screen—that to me is a freaking star," Shiek expressed. "These are the people that move me and inspire me at the same time, and that's why I do things like collaborations. I'm blessed to be around cats who gave me an opportunity. This is my way of giving back."

Shiek, also, gives back through his eight-week acting course. "I really just fell into teaching. I started a company out in Burbank, Calif., called 4140. It was a group of actors, and we would just get down. They were like, 'Shiek, you need to teach.' Teaching to me was for failed actors. I was like, 'I'm not accepting failure,''' he admitted of his unwillingness to teach at first.

However, his attitude would soon change as his "students" began booking jobs. Soon his celebrity friends were reaching out to Shiek to run lines with them.

"The next thing you know, I'm working with Vanessa Williams. Vanessa and I worked on Soul Food! I worked with her for that audition! Then, more people started wanting to do it," he told us.

My class is not just about acting—it's a class about life. It's about how to sustain yourself in this industry."

Currently, Shiek is also producing television shows and films—all of which include some of his students. He has a talk show in the works with Dr. LaSonia Barlow called "Psychological Perspectives with Doc B." There is also a TV pilot that Shiek created with Paris Jones called "The Inner Circle," which is a drama that centers on the lives of rehab patients in a 28-day, in-patient addiction recovery program. The actor/producer also is in the beginning stages of filming a movie titled *Isaac* vs. The Devil, which is about a man whose son is killed by a cop, and he in turn kidnaps the cop's son.

Shiek Mahmud-Bey is living proof that when you're destined to walk a certain path, you will eventually find your way...or it may find you, as was the case for Shiek. However, it's what you do when you've arrived at the crossroads that will determine where you go in life. With the talent, passion and professionalism that Shiek brings to the table, there's no denying that he's skillfully navigating the road he was born to travel.

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Exercise 2: V-Ups

Lie down on your back and extend your arms above your head. The back of your hands should touch the floor while your palms face the ceiling. Keep your legs straight and lift them up, and at the same time raise your upper body off of the floor and reach for your toes with your hands (making something that looks like a "V").

HOW TO GET A GET A

You are not going to get a six-pack from "starting to eat a little better recently" or doing occasional crunches. Crunches just aren't a very effective core exercise because they don't target every part of the abdominal region. There are many better ways to exercise your core. *Black Men* enlisted the assistance of fitness expert, Brandon Carter, to show you how it's done!

For this lesson, Brandon has chosen four exercises that hit every section of the core.

Do four sets of each exercise to failure (meaning, do them in until you can't do anymore with strict/perfect form) and rest 30-60 seconds between each set.

Exercise 1: Bicycles

Lie face up on your back and place your hands behind your head, lightly supporting it with your fingers. Bring your knees to your chest and lift your shoulder blades off the floor without pulling on the neck. Rotate to the left, bringing the right elbow towards the left knee as you straighten the other leg. Switch sides, bringing the left elbow towards the right knee. Continue alternating sides in a 'pedaling' motion.









Exercise 3: Star Fish Crunch

Lay flat on your back. Extend your arms over your head and spread your legs out so that your body forms an "X" on the ground. Bring your torso up and tuck your knees into your chest at the same time.

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Exercise 4: Roman Twist

Seated on the floor with your knees bent, heels on the floor, lean back until the core is activated then lift your feet off the ground. Rotate your torso from one side of the body to the other in a swift but controlled manner.

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The great thing about these four exercises is that you can perform them almost anywhere. All you need is the ground and gravity. If you perform each of these exercises with strict form, one after the other - each until failure - you can just add time to each round or add more rounds as you become stronger and gain muscle endurance.
