Federal investigators are focused on one Ferguson, Mo., police officer who fatally shot an unarmed black teenager, but at least five other police officers and one former officer in the town's 53-member department have been named in civil rights lawsuits alleging the use of excessive force.

In four federal lawsuits, including one that is on appeal, and more than a half-dozen investigations over the past decade, colleagues of Darren Wilson's have separately contested a variety of allegations, including killing a mentally ill man with a Taser, pistol whipping a child, choking and hog-tying a child and beating a man who was later charged with destroying city property because his blood spilled on officers' clothes.

One officer has faced three internal affairs probes and two lawsuits over claims he violated civil rights and used excessive force while working at a previous police department in the mid-2000s. That department demoted him after finding credible evidence to support one of the complaints, and he subsequently was hired by the Ferguson force.

As of this writing that is the latest new pertaining to the ongoing investigation of police officer Darren Wilson who shot and killed Michael Brown.

The story seems to be complicated. One side (the police) claim that Michael Brown attacked the officer and tried to take his gun. Witnesses claim that Brown surrendered and was standing with his hands in the air when Wilson opened fire.

According to Dorian Johnson, he and Michael Brown were walking down the street when they were approached by Wilson, who told both men to "get the fuck out of the street." Wilson then blocked off the street, reached from the car and tried to chock Brown, Brown pulled away and Wilson said that he was going to shoot at the same time that he fired the first shot. Johnson says that Brown was hit twice before throwing his hands in the air to surrender at which time Wilson fired several more shots killing Michael Brown.

The nauseating part of this drama is the fact that shortly after, the media showed photos of Darren Wilson receiving a commendation while showing an unconfirmed clip of Brown shoving a store owner during what was said to be a strong armed robbery supposedly prior to Brown's confrontation with Wilson.



What they fail to mention is that Darren Wilson's police record included being a member of a disbanded police department.

It was disbanded by authorities over racial tensions, the Washington Post reports.

Police faced a series of lawsuits for using unnecessary force, Stichnote said. One black resident, Cassandra Fuller, sued the department claiming a white Jennings police officer beat her in June 2009 on her own porch after she made a joke. A car had smashed into her van, which was parked in front of her home, and she called police. The responding officer asked her to move the van. "It don't run. You can take it home with you if you wan," she answered. She said the officer became enraged, threw her off the porch, knocked her to the ground and kicked her in the storageh.

The department paid Fuller a confidential sum to settle the case, she said.

"It's like a horror story in my mind. I never thought a police officer would pull me off my porch and beat me to the ground, for just laughing," Fuller said in an interview.

The city council deemed tensions between officers and black residents so bad that it was necessary to fire everyone and build a new, more credible department from scratch. Wilson, obviously reapplied and was rehired in Ferguson.

What's equally puzzling about this story is the funds raised in support of Darren Wilson. To date, charities have raised more than \$400,000 to assist Darren Wilson.

Wilson supporters staged a "Support Darren Wilson" rally at Barney's Sports Pub, which is frequented by current and former officers.

"The people here don't know him, but law enforcement is family," said Rhea Rodebaugh, the bar's owner and a former sheriff. "The poor guy is in hiding. He was doing his job."

About 100 people, most of them white, showed up. A table held stacks of navy blue T-shirts for sale, each with a police badge on the front and the words "Officer Darren Wilson We Stand By You 8-9-14."

Several in the crowd had connections to law enforcement, including one who said he knew Wilson from working in private security — and got a call from him on the night of Aug. 9. He said Wilson called to say he couldn't make it to work because of the shooting.

"Really surprised me that he would think to notify somebody to cover a position that he was responsible for after being involved in what he was involved in," the officer said.

The officers voiced their unhappiness with Missouri foor. Jay Nixon, who called for a "speedy prosecution" in the case, a comment that his office later attempted to retract, saying he meant a "speedy investigation." The cops said they aren't buying it since it was from a prepared statement.

Hello, an unarmed African American CHILD was shot to death. Regardless of the circumstances...WHO THE FUCK SUPPORTS THAT?

I really don't know what the hell is going on in this country when we start holding fund raisers for people that JUST MIGHT be found guilty of murder.

The autopsy by the best of the best Dr. Michael Baden indicate that Wilson's story is bogus. I hope those folks who "support" Wilson are decent enough to stop wearing their t-shirts after Darren is found guilty. END TIM

Bettie Page

For most of my life this is how I knew Bettie Page...



I would sneak and look at my Dad's Playboy magazines and from time to time Bettie would be featured as this super hot cartoon chick with some catchy caption beneath the picture.

I'm not sure if you are familiar with Patrick Nagel's artwork

but I just assumed that it was the same type of work.

In my world, Bettie Page was like a realistic Betty Boop. In fact, there was a time that I actually thought they were the same person. To me, Bettie Page was just a lifelike interpretation of the cartoon character Betty Boop.



The day that I found out that the lady in the pictures was actually a real person can only be compared to seeing an Angel.

I was at a restaurant/har named Bettie's

The name didn't ring a bell. I just thought someone named Bettie owned it or something like that ... I don't know.

So...we eating dinner and having drinks and it didn't take long for the beers to get the better of my bladder. I excused myself to go to the restroom and on the walls of the restroom there were photos of the REAL Bettie Page alongside some of the artwork that I had seen in Playboy.

I fell in love with her instantly!

The black and white photos along with the fact that the bar was named after her made me think that she had already passed way.

It all made sense

The artwork must have been the artist way of paying homage to ...

Wait!

Why would anyone want to name a bar after Bettie? And why would they continue to immortalize her in Playboy? Who the hell is this woman?

In wouldn't expect to walk in a bar called Pamela's. Anna Nicole's or Cindy Crawford's...though it could hannen

Page was the second of six children born to Walter Roy Page and Edna Mae Pirtle. At a young age, Page had to face the responsibilities of caring for her vounger siblings. Her parents divorced when she was 10 years old. After her father, whom Page would accuse of molesting her starting at age 13. was imprisoned. Page and her two sisters lived in an orphanage for a year. During this time, Page's mother worked two jobs, one as a hairdresser during the day and washing laundry at night.

As a teenager, Page and her sisters tried different makeup styles and hairdos imitating their favorite movie stars. She also learned to sew. These skills proved useful years later for her pin-up photography when Page did her own makeup and hair and made her own bikinis and costumes. During her early years Bettie recalls a photographer asking her to show up for a photo shoot with many of the bikinis that she had designed. He then put out a catalogue and sold her designs without paying Page for her creations or even crediting her as the one that designed them.

A good student and debate team member at Hume-Fogg High School, she was voted "Most Likely to Succeed". On June 6, 1940, Page graduated as the salutatorian of her high school class. According to Bettie, she was disappointed because the valedictorian earned a full scholarship and the salutatorian only earned money. She missed valedictorian by just a few percentage points. After graduation Bettie enrolled at George Peabody College, with the intention of becoming a teacher. However, the next fall she began studying acting, hoping to become a movie star. At the same time, she got her first job, typing for author Alfred Leland Crabb

Page graduated from Peabody with a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1944.

In 1943, she married high school classmate Billy Neal in a simple courthouse ceremony shortly before he was drafted into the Navy for World War II. For the next few years, she moved from San Francisco to Nashville to Miami and to Port-au-Prince, Haiti, where she felt a special affinity with the country and its culture. In November 1947, back in the United States, she filed for divorce.

Following her divorce, Page worked briefly in San Francisco, and in Haiti. In 1949, she moved to New York City, where she hoped to find work as an actress. In the meantime, she supported herself by working as a secretary. In 1950, while walking along the Coney Island shore, she met Jerry Tibbs, a police officer with an interest in photography. She was a willing model, and Tibbs took pictures of her and put together her first pinup portfolio. It was

Tibbs who first suggested to Bettie that she style her hair with bangs in front, to keep light from reflecting off her high forehead when being photographed. Bangs soon became an integral part of her distinctive look.



In 1954, during one of her annual vacations to Miami, Florida, Page met photographers Jan Caldwell, H. W. Hannau and Bunny Yeager. At that time, Page was the top pin-up model in New York.

Yeager, a former model and aspiring photographer, signed Page for a photo session at the now-closed wildlife park Africa USA in Boca Raton, Florida.

The Jungle Bettie photographs from this shoot are among her most celebrated. They include nude shots with a pair of cheetahs named Mojah and Mbili. The leopard skin patterned Jungle Girl outfit she wore was made, along with much of her lingerie, by Page herself. A large collection of the Yeager photos, and Klaw's, were published in the book Bettie Page Confidential (St. Martin's Press, 1994).

She moved to Southern California in 1979. There she had a nervous breakdown and had an altercation with her landlady. The doctors who examined her diagnosed her with acute schizophrenia, and she spent 20 months in a state mental hospital in San Bernardino, California. After a fight with another landlord she was arrested for assault, but was found not guilty by reason of insanity and placed under state supervision for eight years. She was released in 1992.

A cult following was built around her during the 1980s, of which she was unaware. This renewed attention was focused on her pinup and lingerie modeling rather than those depicting sexual fetishes or bondage, and she gained a certain public redemption and popular status as an icon of erotica from a bygone era.

This attention also raised the question among her new fans of what happened to her after the 1950s.

In a late-1990s interview. Page stated she would not allow any current pictures of her to be shown because of concerns about her weight. However, in 1997. Page changed her mind and agreed to a rare television interview for the aforementioned El True Hollywood Story/Page special on the condition that the location of the interview and her face not be revealed (she was shown with her face and dress electronically blacked out). In 2003, Page allowed a publicity picture to be taken of her for the August 2003 edition of Playboy. In 2006, the Los Angeles Times ran an article headlined A Golden Age for a Pinup, covering an autographing session at her current publicity company, CMG Worldwide, Once again, she declined to be photographed, saying that she would rather be remembered as she was.

In a 1998 interview with Playboy, she commented on her career:

I never thought it was shameful. I felt normal. It's just that it was much better than pounding a typewriter eight hours a day, which gets monotonous.

Sex Symbol Throwback: Brigitte Bardot

As our Top Floor readers know, I'm a big fan of the old-school sex symbols. Today's hotties are great, but let's not forget the iconic babes who blazed the trail for others to follow in their sexy footsteps. Let's give credit where credit is due! Since this month is her birthday, it's perfect timing to celebrate the amazing life of the original Euro "sex kitten", gorgeous Brigitte Bardot.

"Le Bardot" is unique because her life has followed a different path from the typical sex goddess, mainly because she never really wanted to be a sex goddess and because she's a helluva lot more than a beautiful face and a hot bod. At age 79, she's still going strong and making headlines in her native France and around the world. Her no-holds barred, outspoken and "politically incorrect" viewpoints have gotten her arrested and fined on several occasions. Free speech isn't very "free" in France, but she's never let it stop her from expressing. For that alone, she stands apart from other females who have been tagged with the "dumb blonde" sex symbol label over the decades.

Born on September 28, 1939, she became an overnight sex sensation in her first starring role in the movie "And God Created Woman". (1956).



The flick was heavily censored in the U.S. due to some nudity and the subject matter - she portrayed a promiscuous teenage girl seducing men in a small town. Oooohhh la la! But 1950's puritanical America didn't let that stop them from watching her films. Bardot was such a hot little sexpot that audiences loved her and demanded more of the blonde bombshell with the pouty lips and sinfully luscious bod. Today's babes (except Angelina Jolie Jol), buy puffy lips like Bardot's at their plastic surgeon's office! But Brigitte was ALL natural, from head to toe. Ahh, how times have changed, eh Monsieur? Hmmm, there must be something special in that French DNA!

Apart from Bardot's sexy, flirtatiously scandalous films, her biggest impact was on pop culture, with her Euro fashions and piled-high tousled beehive hair. Most people have forgotten or never knew that Bardot was a huge fashion trendsetter. She was the first to make the blonde "bedhead" hairstyle THE fashion "in" look around the world. Countless sex symbols such as Pam Anderson have copied her iconic look...but there's only ONE Bardot!





Unlike most starlets today, she was a natural beauty with a classic bombshell hourglass figure. If "God Created Woman", he definitely performed a miracle on her!

She took her most stunning place in fashion history by being one of the first to wear a bikini, before most American women had ever heard of it, and certainly none were brave enough to wear such itty bitty beachwear in public. The world got its first glimpse of the bikini on screen because "Le Bardot" wore the hot creation. She loved to stroll around St. Tropez in her bikini and the photographers recorded every little liggle!

She also popularized the bare "off the shoulder" fashion which is actually nicknamed the "bardot" neckline. So, guys, the next time your chick bares her shoulders for you, please remember to thank Ms. Bardot, okay?!

In 1973 at age 39 she officially retired from show business, preferring to use her fame to promote animal rights and speak out on a variety of issues she felt strongly about. In 1986, she founded the Brigitte Bardot Foundation For The Welfare and Protection of Animals and began her amazing journey from sex goddess to fiery political activist. She's raised millions for animal rights causes over the years.

Like most women cast in the sex symbol role, Bardot had her share of drama in the marriage department, having been married four times. But in her
case, "four times a charm" because she's remained
happily married since 1992 to controversial rightwing French nationalist political leader, Bernard
d'Ormale. Extremely outspoken, she's never backed
down an iota from making her views known on a
range of "hot button" subjects that most people are
afraid to bring into the open, particularly immigration of Muslims into France.

In 1999, she wrote a book which included her personal statement entitled "Open Letter to My Lost France". She writes:

"My country, France, my homeland, my land is again invaded by an overpopulation of foreigners, especially Muslims".

France is not a bastion of free speech - merely speaking about immigration or racial matters in that country can get you fined or thrown in jail. The French court fined her 30,000 francs in June 2000 for her comments regarding Muslims, who she accused of not integrating into French society and mistreating animals. She had been fined in 1997 for the publication of this same letter in Le Figaro and again in 1998. In her 2003 book, Un cri dans le silence ("A Scream in the Silence"), she again warned that Muslims were taking over France through illegal immigration.

In 2008, she was put on trial and charged with "inciting racial hatred", hit with yet another huge fine. In addition to immigration, she's also spoken out on a variety of topics from gun control to global warming.


