






























While The Romp Magazine's very own Bunnie Kim got her sexy on, we sat down with her and spoke about some very important things. Like nail art and naked portraits.

Bunnie: I'm very excited and can't wait to see how it turns out.


You also work for The Romp Magazine as a celebrity interviewer. In this issue you spoke with international superstar DJ Chuckie. How you think you went?

Hitting the shelves every year since 2002, the Wild Summer compilation series shows no sign of letting up. This December heralds the release of the latest offering.

The first disc gets underway with an elegant, progressive house slow-burner from Scotland's finest, Calvin Harris, before tearing into colossal festival trouse from the likes of Tiesto and Armin, all clean drums and swerving up-bass as the Queenslanders show their cards early. They go big on the breathy vocals of Elie Golding and the wonderful Lana Del Rey, as the majestic Summertime Sadness enchants.

There is no-nonsense to the layout – the disc features quick-fire edits which are not so much mixed as dropped into each other to keep the pace up. Rave Radio's own track sits admirably amongst the cuts of bigger names, before their jump-up remix of Checkmate brings the noise from Wiz Khalifa and Snoop Lion.

As the mix breathes on, the sounds stays local, with The Stafford Brothers FMF anthem meeting the megazoidal Move To The Rhythm as the disc goes up a gear.

You can smell the coconut oil and taste the sangria on Avicii's Wake Me Up, before Mat Zo's tour de force Pyramid Scheme brings something a little different to the mix.

As the disc thunders on, there is time for a surprise, as Rachel Collier seductively breathes over a classic house record from Ray Foxx, easing the listener towards the gigantic DJ Isaac re-imagination of Martin Garrix's Animals.

WE ARE PLANET PERFECTO VOLUME 03




This month saw the release of the third in Paul Oakenfold's Perfecto Las Vegas series - the first of which remains the highest selling DJ compilation ever released in the US.

The two-disc compilation is split into two concepts – the first reflecting the sound that Oakenfold smashes out to packed dance floors at the Palms Casino Resort in Vegas, while the second encapsulates the sonic incarnation of the world's most famous party island.

Disc one is all about Oakenfold's big room manifesto: think Swedish House Mafia with a Mohawk and nose ring. It opens with the elaborate I Need You, an explosive celebration of colour and sound over a ripping bassline and 80's nu-romantic vocal before charging into a trouse hybrid with chunky drums and dramatic breakdowns. Gold even offers a nod to trap, as Oakenfold coversall the bases.

The listener is treated to the Moe Aly epic reimagining of Oakenfold's classic Southern Sun, before WOW from Maisen and Dragen bring the disc to a peak complete with synth lead, housey drum and farty brostep riff. From here, epic vocal gives way to the non-conforming Raise Your Glasses, a ballad with a cheeky breakbeat which evolves into an arms-in-the-air destroyer. To close, Eddie Halliwell's signature techy stabs and rasping bass bring in Move Like u Stole It which both sums up and rounds off a very classy mix. ZZ Ward's vocal is reminiscent of Adele, with the fireworks of the melody erupting below.



Am Legion

Dutch drum and bass goliaths Noisia join the colourfully named Metropolis and Orifice Vulgatron of Foreign Beggars to drop their debut collaboration this month under the moniker I Am Legion.

Having met at Glastonbury and bonded over a shared need for grimy basslines and street prose about five years ago, the five individuals have finally ended the wait for a long-playing release.

The album begins profoundly, as an introspective wet synth whooshes into the deepest of basslines, stretching out languidly for a minute as the synth ebbs and flows between the cones. Just as it is about to drop, it ends abruptly as a perpetual teaser.

Farrda comes in deep, dark and heavy. It is confronting, dizzy and somewhat disconcerting as the MCs go hard from the outset over Noisia's sub-bass tattoo. It's a bouncy number, with no breathing space between verses.

The standout is Make Those Move, which has one of the deepest sub-bass thumps you'll hear. A proper wall-shaker, this is Legionstep in a nutshell. Broken, raspy with plenty of reverb on the track, it's laced with alien swoops and liquid jabs. It's an absolute banger, an unforgettable cut that harks back to the original UK dubstep sound.

From here, the experimental heaviness of Jelly Fish makes way for the glitchy tripper Ice which puts the hood up and eyes down for a moody stomp. Loose Leaves lets up a little in pace, but retains the intensity of what has come before for a modern trip-hop workout.

From out of left-field, I Am Legion lobs in a surprise with Choosing For You, the only full-on trap number on the

Unassuming 23-year-old Londoner Mat Zo made his name on the scene as a prolific progressive trance producer on the Anjunabeats label, supported widely by label bosses Above and Beyond.


However, it was a couple of releases in 2011 which cemented Zo as a player, and simultaneously broke open a genre. Superman and Rebound (with Arty)combined elements of trance and big room house and have invited scores of poor imitations ever since which have muddied the pool.

His hotly anticipated album Damage Control has just dropped, and once again, the game has changed. The album begins with a haunting sub continental chant over delicate strings and gorgeous synth which serves as a stunning and emotive introduction. It is followed by a warm liquid bassline reminiscent of Roger Sanchez's blissful beach bar classic, Another Chance.

Only For You is wonderfully languid and nostalgically electric with a lush vocal. Megahit Easy with fellow skyrocket Porter Robinson needs no explanation a Daft Punk tribute which made its way to top spot on the iTunes and Beatport charts, this is the one which announced both producers as dance music dons.

Caller ID is a fascinating bass-heavy trap motif with Eastern instrumentation, and is quickly followed by the




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















When it comes to badges on cars, very few acronyms denote performance like 'GTS' (Gran Turismo Sport). Porsche has recently unveiled its GTS models for its Boxter and Cayman sports cars.

They both come with a 3.4-litre flat-six (or 'boxer' for car freaks) engine but the Cayman puts out 250kW and 380Nm while the Boxter gets a measly 243kW and 370Nm. The Boxter comes standard with a six-speed manual transmission, while a PDK dual-clutch auto is optional, but is standard on the Cayman. With the PDK they'll hit 100 kmh in 4.7 and 4.6 seconds respectively and they'll reach 280 kmh.

The engine actually passes the strict Euro 6 emissions and fuel consumption is around 8.2L/100km with PDK form and 9.0L/100km with the manual.

Both cars come with the usually optional "Sport Chrono" performance pack as standard, as well as Porsche Active Suspension Management (PASM) adaptive dampers to provide racecar-like handling and driving performance.

To make sure everyone knows your car isn't the run of the mill Boxter or Cayman, the GTS gets some sweet





The 2014 Ford Mustang GT delivers some of the best performance bang for the buck, bringing with it a level of sophistication that's surprising considering the brash sound and classic looks.

The car is track-tested at more than 200 mph, running on the zero-to-60 mph sprint at takes just 3.5 seconds, while flying through the quarter-mile in 11.8 seconds. The Shelby GT500 not only accelerates with brute force, but it turns and stops surprisingly well too, making it brilliant on the track.

Along with its convertible sibling, the GT500 packs the most powerful production V8 engine on Earth (662 horsepower at 6,500 rpm, 631 lbs. of torque at 4,000 rpm). This is based on current production models and manufacturer horsepower data. With the 5.8L DOHC 32-valve aluminium-block V8 on hand, this car has enough power for its driver to leave the competition in the dust.

Unlike some of its competitors, the GT500 doesn't come with an automatic gearbox. Shifting duties are handled exclusively by a traditional TREMEC 6-speed manual transmission, which features increased torque and rpm capacity due to its dual-disc clutch design.





As has come to be expected from a benchmark BMW, the interior is beautifully trimmed on flawless leather. The seats are nicely contoured with low seating positions, giving it that sports car feel.

The rear seats are easy to access with great legroom, although not so much in the headroom department. An eight-speed automatic transmission comes standard with the entire 4 Series range. A six-speed manual is also available as a no cost option.





Both the entry-level range produces 135kW of power, although, the 2.0-litre turbo-diesel four-cylinder 420d gets 380Nm of torque, up by 110Nm from the turbo petrol 420i. Equipped with a tuned-up version of the entry-level petrol engine, the 428i produces 180kW of power and 350Nm of torque. It is claimed that it reaches 0-100km/h in 5.8-seconds, 1.5 seconds faster than the entry-level range. The flagship of the series, the 435i, packs a 3.0-litre turbo petrol six-cylinder and gets 225kW and 400Nm of torque, while reaching 0-100km/h in 5.1-seconds.

Standard across the range are 18's, fog lights, reversing camera with front and rear sensors, bi-xenon headlights, LED interior lights, auto lights and wipers, dual-zone climate control, Bluetooth phone and audio connectivity, and an 8.8-inch display with satellite navigation and 20Gb storage. Safety features common across the range include ABS, cornering brake control, stability and traction control, and front








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FIFA has banned Barcelona from transferring players for the next two transfer windows due to breaches relating to the international transfer and registration of players under the age of 18. The ruling means the Spanish giants are prevented from either buying or selling players until 2015.

The sanctions follow investigations conducted by both the FIFA Transfer Matching




Shane Mosley fight, possibly driving home the final nail in the coffin of boxing in Australia.

The latest embarrassing episode for the sport first saw Mosley walking away from the fight hours before the weigh-in due to a contractual dispute with fight promoter Vlad Warton over Mosley's payment.

Combined with poor ticket sales and pay-per-view buys it seemed like the fight would never see the light of day. However, the fight was announced to be back on not long after its initial cancellation, with Mundine's camp putting their hand up to bankroll the event.


The fight came and further disappointed fans (the few who were still interested) when they were treated to another farcical turn of events, with Mundine winning the bout when Mosley was forced to withdraw after only six rounds due to suffering back spasms. The crowd in the attendance loudly voiced their displeasure, and rightfully so.

There's been several farces surrounding boxing in Australia in recent years. Danny Green vs. Paul Briggs in 2010 is considered by many as one of the worst nights in Australian boxing history. Briggs was comically dropped after just 29 seconds when Green grazed the top of his head with a left jab. Viewers were disgusted from the apparent dive.



Never before in the history of mixed martial arts have two Olympic medallists faced off inside the octagon. UFC bantamweight champion Ronda Rousey, one of the most popular and polarising figures in the world of mixed martial arts, won the bronze medal for judo at the 2008 Beijing Olympics. Her opponent, Sara McMann, is a wrestling world champion and silver medal winner for freestyle wrestling at the 2004 Athens games.

Both women are undefeated coming in to the fight and pose a very interesting stylistic matchup on paper. Many believed if anything









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
